As a pious man, you should expect a quick end to your ordeal. After all, who ever heard of the innocent being brought to an end? Rather, it is the wicked who receive God's anger and judgment. I personally have had a vision which made it clear that absolute righteousness before God is impossible for mortal man in his fragility. However, while judgment certainly falls on the foolish, I urge you to recognize that God corrects and delivers the pious. He will restore you to comfort and prosperity, once you have learned the lesson.

You have tried to make an empty case against me, your friend! But, if you were fair, you would recognize that my righteousness remains. Life brings hardship for every man. But my hardship is unbearably miserable. I won't ever see good again before I die, for life is so short. So I must complain about my situation now or never! God, how long will you let my misery go on? Why is this happening? What have I done to deserve this? Why don't You forgive whatever I've done and let life go on?

No matter what he trusts in, it will not save him. This is what makes God's way so wonderful, for He deals justly with the blameless and the wicked. You will be restored to God's favor.

	11:20	However, the wicked can only expect doom.
Job	12:1-2	Of course, you are the only wise men!
	12:3	However, you have nothing over me in knowing these matters.
	12:4-6	The fact is that injustice can be viewed in all of life.
	12:7-8	Nature itself will teach you that much.

Eliphaz	15:1-2 15:3-5 15:6 15:7-8 15:9-10 15:11 15:12-16 15:17-19 15:20-24 15:25-35	A man of wisdom would not talk like you are foolishly doing. Your sin is leading you to speak so. Thus, you are condemning yourself with your own mouth! Do you alone have the wisdom of age or of divine revelation? We have the wisdom of age, some of us being older than your father! How can you reject what God is trying to tell you? How can you, a mere man, think you are righteous enough to argue with God? I'll tell you what wisdom dictates: It is the wicked who suffers, and he suffers because he is wicked.

If I were where you are, I could talk like you or I could provide real comfort. But look at where I am! I can do nothing to alleviate my suffering. God has totally devastated me, and He did so without my deserving it at all! Earth, don't let this injustice be covered up! I have a heavenly witness of my case against God. Would that I could take my case up with Him, for I won't be here much longer. God, who will help me? These friends are no help. I am despised and diminished—unjustly. You guys don't know what you're saying. My life has fallen apart, but they pretend I have hope. My destiny is death, and what hope does that bring?
Bildad	18:1-2 18:3 18:4 18:5-21	Come on, Job. Stop talking so stupidly. Why do you think we're the stupid ones? Do you think the earth revolves around you? It is the wicked who experiences calamities (like yours).
Job	19:1-3 19:4-6 19:7-12 19:13-19 19:20 19:21-22 19:23-24 19:25 19:26-27 19:28-29	How can you treat me like this? Even if I had sinned, I don't deserve what God has done to me. I protest the injustice, but He won't let me be heard. He has isolated me from everyone I hold dear, and I am barely alive. Can't you have some compassion rather than attacking me? I wish my case was forever written down for everyone to read. I know I have a living advocate who will stand for me in the end. I will die, but I will see God—and that thought overwhelms me. As for you friends, that's when you will know what it's like to be judged because of sin.

Zophar	20:1-2 20:3 20:4-19 20:20-29	I am so troubled I must speak up. Job, I will answer your insults with insight. Though it seems that the wicked prospers, that is short-lived. God makes sure that the wicked is judged for his sin.
Job	21:1-3	Listen to me! Hear what I say before you attack me.
	21:4-6	Look at what God has done to me (a righteous person)!
	21:7-16	Then look at how the wicked who oppose God are living well.
	21:17-18	How often do we really see God judging them?
	21:19	Sure, his sins may fall on his children.
	21:20	I say, let him be judged for his own iniquity!

Eliphaz	22:1-4 22:5-11 22:12-14 22:15-20 22:21-30	You aren't suffering because of your righteousness. You are suffering because of your sins—sins of omission and commission. How can you argue with God, who is so transcendent? Do you really want to continue in the wickedness which He judges? Repent, Job, and all will be well with you again.

But if I could just present my case to God, He would hear and deliver me. The trouble is, God won't let me come before Him. God knows I am innocent of evildoing. Yet look what He has done to me. I will not be silent about this injustice. Why doesn't God judge now those who are truly wicked? They sin willfully. Only death seems to bring judgment on the wicked. But then, the innocent and needy die too! Prove me wrong—if you can!

What have all your words accomplished? Yes, God has complete control of the universe. No way will I lie by saying I am not righteous. May it be my enemy who is identified with the wicked, not me, for the godless have no access to Him. Let me tell you how God really deals with the wicked, although you should realize this already. The posterity of the wicked will be adversely affected by his godlessness, and the wicked himself will die filled with terror. Man has found ways to get to earth's most precious metals and stones, but where can he find wisdom? Wisdom is of far greater value than any jewel or metal, but where can it be found? God knows! He established wisdom and her supreme value, and He told man what wisdom is: to fear Him and avoid evil. How I wish my life was like it used to be! Then I knew God was close to me. Then I was richly blessed
