

DAILY EVENING PRAYER

The Officiant may begin Evening Prayer by reading an opening sentence of Scripture.

Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands be an evening sacrifice.

PSALM 141:2

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

1 JOHN 1:8-9

CONFESSION OF SIN

Let us humbly confess our sins to Almighty God.

Silence is kept. All kneeling, the Officiant and People say

**Almighty and most merciful Father,
we have erred and strayed from your ways like lost sheep.
We have followed too much the devices
and desires of our own hearts.
We have broken your holy laws,
We have left undone what we ought to have done, and
we have done what we ought not to have done.
O Lord, have mercy on us pitiful sinners.
Spare those, O God, who confess their faults.
Restore those who truly repent,
as you have promised through Jesus Christ our Lord.
And grant, O merciful Father, for his sake,
that we may live a godly, righteous and disciplined life,
to the praise of your holy name. Amen.**

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant you absolution and remission of all your sins, true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

THE INVITATORY

All stand.

Officiant O Lord, open our lips;

People **And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.**

Officiant O God, make speed to save us;

People **O Lord, make haste to help us.**

Officiant Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

People **As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.**
Officiant Praise the Lord.
People **The Lord's Name be praised.**

The following or some other suitable hymn or Psalm may be sung or said.

At the end of the Psalms the Gloria Patri (Glory be...) is sung or said

One or more Lessons, as appointed, are read, the Reader first saying

A citation giving chapter and verse may be added.

After each Lesson the Reader may say

The Word of the Lord.

The Song of Mary

My soul magnifies the Lord, *

according to the riches of His grace which He lavished on us.
In all wisdom and insight, He made known to us the mystery of His will,*
according to His kind intention which He purposed in Him
with a view to an administration suitable to the fullness of the times,*
that is, the summing up of all things in Christ, things in the heavens and things
on the earth.
In Him also we have obtained an inheritance,*
having been predestined according to His purpose
who works all things after the counsel of His will,*
to the end that we who were the first to hope in Christ
would be to the praise of His glory.*
In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth,
the gospel of your salvation*
having also believed, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise,*
who is given as a pledge of our inheritance,
with a view to the redemption of *God's own* possession,*
to the praise of His glory.

Amen.

A COLLECT FOR PROTECTION

O God, the life of all who live, the light of the faithful and the strength of those who labor: We thank you for the blessings of the day that is past, and humbly ask for your protection through the coming night. Bring us in safety to the morning hours; through him who died and rose again for us, your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

THE GENERAL THANKSGIVING

Officiant and People

**Almighty God, Father of all mercies,
we your unworthy servants give you humble thanks
for all your goodness and loving-kindness
to us and to all whom you have made.
We bless you for our creation, preservation,
and all the blessings of this life;
but above all for your immeasurable love
in the redemption of the world by our Lord Jesus Christ;
for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory.
And, we pray, give us such an awareness of your mercies,
that with truly thankful hearts we may show forth your praise,
not only with our lips, but in our lives,
by giving up our selves to your service,
and by walking before you
in holiness and righteousness all our days;
Through Jesus Christ our Lord,**

to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit,
be honor and glory throughout all ages. Amen.
