Growth Group Questions



1. Think about and share some misconceptions about God into which you could inadvertently slip. Do you sometimes wish God was different than He is?

2. God, as revealed in His Word, is perhaps an unexpected sort of God—One God in Three Persons. Look at a couple of these passages (or others) with fresh eyes, seeing our Triune God, getting our feet underneath what is difficult to understand or explain, yet is true about God.

a. Romans 8.1-11

Ephesians 1.3-14

b. 2 Thessalonians 2.13-14

1 Peter 1.1-2

c. Jude 20-21

2 Corinthians 13.14

3. What is something beautiful about our Triune God? Think biblically! How can this beauty of One God in Three Persons transform a part of you?

4. King David is gripped with one thought: gazing on the beauty of the Lord, seeking Him in His temple—read Psalm 27.4-5. Think of and practice a gazing-posture in your life this week. Thank God that even your desire for a gazing-heart comes from Him, and He will enable you to grow in your joyful-obsession.
