They hurried to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph and the baby, who was lying in the feeding trough. Then the shepherds went and told others about the baby Jesus. Everyone who heard about Jesus was surprised and amazed. Mary thought about everything that was happening and tried to understand it. The shepherds returned to their fields, praising God because everything had happened just as the angel said.

Christ Connection: The birth of Jesus was good news! Jesus was not an ordinary baby. He is God's Son, sent to earth from heaven. Jesus, the promised Savior, came into the world to deliver us from sin and death.

Bible Storytelling Tips

- Use props: As you tell the story, display a nativity scene.
 Allow kids to move the pieces around as you tell the story.
- Adjust lighting:
 Dim the lights to simulate a nighttime setting. Shine a bright light when describing the angel's appearance.

Extra Activities

Gather the kids together and instruct them to stand up. Challenge them to sit down when they think exactly one minute has elapsed. Use a stopwatch and keep track of who sits closest to a minute without going over. Play additional rounds using different lengths of time.

SAY • In that game, we didn't know exactly when a minute would be up, but we had the ability to count seconds to try and come close. Waiting for something can be especially hard if you don't know when it will happen.

Imagine God's people, who had been waiting for thousands of years. They did not know exactly when the Messiah would come, but they knew God would be faithful. When Jesus was born, it was somewhat unexpected. If it hadn't been for the angels proclaiming the news to shepherds, only Mary and Joseph would have even known the Messiah was there! But all that waiting was worth it when Jesus was born to be God's promised Savior.

Form two teams of kids. Give each team a piece of paper and a pencil. Instruct a player on each team to write the word *CHRISTMAS* vertically down the left side of the paper, one letter per line. On the right side of the paper, she should write it in the opposite way, starting at the bottom and writing up (one letter per line).

Challenge teams to fill in between the letters to create new words. (Examples: CowS, HulA, RooM, InpuT, SeaS, TikI, MotoR, ArcH, SoniC) If teams get stuck as time runs out, allow kids to consult a dictionary.

SAY • What are some things you think of when you hear the word Christmas? [*Call on kids to share.*] Great answers. When we hear our Bible story today, see if you notice some of the words that were mentioned.

Review Opener

SAY • Jesus' birth was good news! Jesus wasn't born into the world to just show people the right way to live or be kind to people; **Jesus was born to be God's promised Savior.** A *savior* is someone who saves from danger or destruction. Jesus was born to rescue sinners from sin and death.

Review Closer

Journal and prayer (5 minutes)

Distribute journal pages and pencils. Guide kids to think about and answer the questions listed on the page:

- What does this story teach me about God or the gospel?
- What does the story teach me about myself?
- Are there any commands in this story to obey? How are they for God's glory and my good?
- Are there any promises in this story to remember? How do they help me trust and love God?
- How does this story help me to live on mission better?

As kids journal, invite them to share their ideas. Then pray, thanking God for the greatest gift—His Son.

Questions for Younger Kids

- 1. Why did Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem? (to be registered in the census, Luke 2:1-5)
- 2. Why was Jesus laid in a manger? (*There was no guest room available, Luke 2:7*)
- 3. Who were Jesus' first visitors? (*shepherds*, *Luke 2:8,16*)
- 4. Why is Jesus' birth so incredible? Guide kids to discuss both the unusual circumstances of Jesus' arrival—such as the angel choirs proclaiming His birth—and the miraculous nature of Jesus' full divinity being wrapped in full humanity. Remind kids that Jesus the Messiah had been promised to come for thousands of years, and God is faithful.
- 5. Why is it important that Jesus came as a human baby? Help kids understand that God's plan to destroy sin required a perfect sacrifice. Jesus' birth as a human meant that He could grow up and lay down His life for us. He could live the perfect human life we are unable to live and die the kind of death we deserve. Jesus' full humanity is why He could die to save humans.
- 6. Why is it important that Jesus remained God?

 Explain that Jesus' nature as fully God is what allowed

 Him to bear the weight of God's punishment for sin

 in a human body. The complete power of God in Jesus

 also gave Him the power to reject temptation and live a

 perfectly sinless life.
- SAY Jesus was born to be God's promised Savior. He was born fully human and did not stop being fully God. Jesus is the only Savior; no one is like Him. Jesus grew up, never sinned, and died for our sin. On the third day, He rose again to defeat sin and death.


Questions for Older Kids

- 1. Why do you think Jesus was born in such a humble way rather than in a palace to a wealthy family? Guide kids to consider how Jesus can relate to ordinary people because of His upbringing. He gave up His glory and power in heaven to live humbly among people. Jesus birth reflects how His kingdom's values differ from the world's values. We can boldly and humbly approach His throne in prayer.
 - (Option: Choose a volunteer to read Heb. 4:15-16.)
- 2. Why was Jesus' birth good news? Help kids understand that Jesus came because we needed Him. God showed His love for us by sending His Son into the world. We were separated from God because of our sins, but God was working out His promise to rescue sinners through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. (Option: Choose a volunteer to read John 3:16.)
- 3. Why should we tell others about Jesus? Lead kids to recognize that salvation through Jesus bring the privilege and responsibility of sharing the gospel with the world.

 God calls us to live as witnesses to the saving power of Jesus—in what we say and how we live.
 - (Option: Choose a volunteer to read Ps. 66:16.)


