Dear Friends,

We are having the plaster repaired in the parish offices and the church. In our offices, as you may have noticed the surface of the plaster bubbles up and flakes off along the lower portion of many walls, leaving areas of exposed unpainted plaster and lots of plaster debris on the carpeting. The frustrating thing is that shortly after a plaster wall is repaired and painted it begins to bubble up again, and in a couple of years our walls will look like we never fixed them. I am told: 1) that the bubbling up of the plaster is caused by moisture wicking up from the ground; 2) this happens because there is no moisture barrier between the walls and the foundation; and 3) the only cure for the problem is to remove walls to get a moisture barrier in place, which is just not feasible. So – we’re stuck. We treat the symptoms, not the disease; every few years we patch the surface and repaint, but we cannot solve the foundational problem, we cannot remove the underlying cause.

And so it is with our own lives and what the Bible refers to as our sin nature. We all live under the same conditions – we regularly leave undone what we ought to have done, and do what we ought not to have done; we follow too much the devices and desires of our own hearts; we offend against God’s holy laws. In more everyday language, we do not much seek God’s plan for our lives, we often live as though He does not exist or has no claim on us; we do pretty much what pleases us – and then there are all those incidental sins – the regular, habitual wrong-doing we all engage in (gossip, little lies, greediness, selfishness, jealousy, grumpiness, stinginess, and a hundred others). Sometimes we can patch up the surface and repaint: by the grace of God sometimes we can see where repair is needed – recognize our fault – and repent and receive forgiveness. Wall looks good again and that is good; it is a whole lot better than doing nothing and letting the ugliness just get worse and worse. Repenting and receiving forgiveness is a bit like fixing our plaster walls – it is needed and it works, but typically it is not that long before the plaster starts bubbling up again – we repeat the sin we have repented of, been forgiven for; we fall right back into our patterns of self-centered, nearly godless living. We are unable to fix the underlying cause – we cannot install the moisture barrier, we cannot remove our sin nature.

Glory be to God that He has the long-term cure for us. By faith we receive His Son Jesus as our Lord and Savior, and we find a reduction in the bubbling up of our plaster – the Holy Spirit begins to change our hearts and our behavior from within; we begin to desire more of God’s ways and less of our own; we begin to sin less. The sin nature – our foundational flaw – is still there, but it produces less destruction. And if we persist in our faith, at the end we are purified, made spotless and refined – our walls are smooth, perfect; the moisture problem we could not fix is removed, as we enter eternity with our Lord.

Lent is our season to focus on patching our walls – where we spot the ugly places and we seek their repair through repentance and restoration; we confess and are forgiven, wall patched. Good Friday and Easter are just around the corner – the days we remember and celebrate God’s permanent fix for our condition: the sacrifice of the Son, blood shed for us, that by faith we might receive Him as Savior and Lord, be filled with the Holy Spirit, and begin the walk of faith that leads to eternal life. Patching the walls is good – but let us never forget that our ultimate fix, the purity we seek, lies ahead.

In *Our Favorite Sins*, Todd Hunter has done an excellent job of assessing the human condition. Through great research by the Barna Group, he pinpoints the sins that have become strongholds. Knowing deeply that what the heart desires, the will chooses, and the mind justifies, and the desperate condition of our hearts, Hunter pastorally leads the sinner to Christ. ## Mission Work

Ever felt called to work with a mission organization..... well one of our members here at Prince George has heard and responded to that call.

**Susan Boyette moved to Lebanon, Pennsylvania, at the end of January this year to begin basic training with "Youth with a Mission" (YWAM) called "Crossroads Discipleship Training". She would like to share some of her journey so far and to ask for your prayerful support as she heads off soon on her first mission journey.**

Susan says... "We call our small Christian army "The Awesome Foursome" (her class at basic training) and we are on "Fire" for Christ. We have had a fantastic time in these first few months, receiving some excellent teaching on topics such as

- Heart of the Father - Gods Heart
- Spiritual Warfare/Vision
- Divine Plumb line
- Grace
- Missions
- Intimate relationship with Christ
- Evangelism, and apologetics

all of which have been so great words cannot describe. These courses have increased my knowledge of God and I am now realizing how much he loves each of us. My love for God has increased as well. I thought I had understood his love and my love but not after these great lectures. My relationship with God is now much more intimate and I know it will continue to grow as I step out and respond to Gods call in my life! This can be the same for you too! God is truly an Awesome God!

Alongside our classroom teaching we have a busy schedule, which includes:

- prayer walks once a week
- intercession groups many times during a week
- teaching English to Nepali Refugees in Harrisburg on Saturdays every week (see picture). This I find to be a truly fulfilling work for God - these are the most humble, appreciative, loving, happy people I have ever seen, not to mention ever helped, and they are so thankful for everything. What this does to our hearts is a blessing."

**YWAM's motto is "To know God and to make Him known", so all students take part in a mission trip and Susan's class is no exception.**

**She writes:** "We are leaving April 4th for our 2 month outreach. We begin with one month in the Ukraine visiting the cities of Kiev, Saki and Crimea. We will be working with orphanages, Mercy Trucks ( Dental Hygiene) women shelters, local family needs, and the local churches. We will be on a train (the Orient Express) from Kiev to Crimea (S Ukraine) for 15 hrs.! (then 15 hrs. back to Kiev!!!) I am taking Russian - we all are on a quick course - yes that's right - Russian...me!! I need the word(s) for "Can I see your ticket please?" I have to say, me on a train for 15 hours one way is a very long ride. Since, having to try and learn Russian, I now know how our Nepalese Refugees from Bhutan feel trying to learn English! On May 4th we will leave the Ukraine and fly to London for a month. It will be an exciting time to be in England with the 2012 Olympics starting this summer, and we will be working with local churches, orphanages, women shelters etc. We will return to US on June 4th.

**Please pray for Susan, along with her classmates Kevin, Stephen and Grace, their team leader, Beck (a wonderful lady from Canada and a strong leader) and her children, Isaac (8) and Chloe (13) as they make preparations for their trip. Please pray specifically for the following and anything else God puts on your heart to include:**

- Safe journeys
- Language learning (a subject close to my heart at the moment....)
- Relationships with each other as they journey together
- The people they will meet and be able to share Jesus with as they travel
- Their personal walk with God as they step out in new and exciting ways for Him

# NOTES FROM THE CHOIR LOFT

## The Best Is Yet To Come . . .

Sarah and I love a song which has marked significant points in our lives, including her father's funeral, and the farewell service at our last church in England prior to coming to Prince George. It is especially significant to us as a dear friend in Wellspring wrote it. It is a triptych on several levels, speaking of the past present and future, as well as quoting Jesus words of himself as 'The Way, The Truth and The Life'.

*What lies ahead is hidden from our sight.  
We walk by faith: that's all the light we need.  
We only know the path we tread is right,  
and gladly go wherever it may lead.  
In Christ, the way, we place our total trust  
to lead us to our final home.  
Though we have all, for we have Jesus Christ,  
yet this we know: the best is yet to come.*

*Through all the trials we have undergone  
he's kept his promise he would be our guide.  
In joy and certain hope we travel on,  
his Holy Spirit ever at our side.*

*On Christ, the truth, we know we can rely  
to finish what he has begun.  
Though we have all, for we have Jesus Christ,  
yet this we know: the best is yet to come.*

*We are the body Christ now bears on Earth,  
sustaining one another by his love.  
He values each as of the greatest worth:  
so hand in hand we aim for heav'n above.  
Christ is the life which beats with in our hearts,  
to make us what we must become.  
Though we have all, for we have Jesus Christ,

Once again we find ourselves at a key point in our lives, both as a natural family and the church family. The Lord is calling us on, in part through circumstance, and we all need to walk by faith. We should do this anyway, but sometimes it's good to be reminded. Faith that the Lord knows what is best for us. Faith that the Lord knows the 'big picture':

*For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD,  
"plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give  
you hope and a future.*

*Jeremiah 29 v 11*

It is easy to dwell on what is being lost and to be angry over the reasons – indeed, I have been there myself. We can devote a lot of energy to trying to second-guess the Lord as to the reasons why things happen. If you're there now, I encourage you to leave it with the Lord. He is God and we are not. Instead:

- remember the good things of the past and be thankful. Raise an Ebenezer (a pile of stones as a reminder)!
- be faithful in the present, in prayer, seeking the

Lord's will for our individual families and the church family of Prince George. Especially, please support Paul and the vestry in prayer as they seek the Lord's choice for staff, and for those who will carry an extra load until replacements are appointed.

- look to the future with eager anticipation of what the Lord will do here. As Paul reminded us last Sunday, there is a paradox in operation:

*continue to work out your salvation with fear  
and trembling, for it is God who works in you  
to will and to act in order to fulfill his good  
purpose. Philippians 2 v 11 – 12*

The future is a collaboration between us and the Lord.

One of my all time favorite hymns is *The Day Thou Gavest Lord Is Ended*. It reminds me that I am part of something much bigger: it gives me a picture of a worldwide 'tide of worship' which sweeps around the earth, not pulled by the gravity of the moon, but by love for the Son!

*We thank Thee that Thy church, unsleeping,  
While earth rolls onward into light,  
Through all the world her watch is keeping,  
And rests not now by day or night.*

*As o'er each continent and island  
The dawn leads on another day,  
The voice of prayer is never silent,  
Nor dies the strain of praise away.*

*The sun that bids us rest is waking  
Our brethren 'neath the western sky,  
And hour by hour fresh lips are making  
Thy wondrous doings heard on high.*

*So be it, Lord; Thy throne shall never,  
Like earth's proud empires, pass away:  
Thy kingdom stands, and grows forever;  
Till all Thy creatures own Thy sway.*

That final verse brings to mind the great vision of John as he experiences Heaven:

*After this I looked, and there before me was a great  
multitude that no one could count, from every nation,  
tribe, people and language, standing before the throne  
and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes  
and were holding palm branches in their hands. And  
they cried out in a loud voice:*

*"Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne,


