Dear Friends

The clergy of the Diocese had a retreat recently at Camp St. Christopher with the bishop, the first day of which was devoted to silence. The bishop gave a series of short talks on Jesus Christ – His temptations, silences, loneliness and joys – and asked us to be silent until lunch the 2<sup>nd</sup> day, which we did. I found it remarkably refreshing, and I am encouraging us all to make some time for silence – we have a problem with noise in our culture, and silence is part of the antidote. In *The Screwtape Letters*, C.S. Lewis addresses “Noise” through a letter of Screwtape, a senior devil, to his understudy Wormwood. Here are the devil's words, from the imaginative mind of Lewis:

Music and silence – how I detest them both.... How thankful we should be that . . . no square inch [of hell], no moment [in hell], has been surrendered to either of these abominable forces, but all has been occupied by Noise – Noise, the grand dynamism, the audible expression of all that is exultant, ruthless, and virile – Noise which alone defends us from silly qualms, despairing scruples, and impossible desires. We [Satan's troops] will make the whole universe a noise in the end. We have already made great strides in this direction as regards Earth. The melodies and silences of Heaven will be shouted down in the end....[*The Screwtape Letters*, pp. 119-120; Harper Collins, 2001]

Lewis was writing 65 years ago, that is, before the mp3 player, rock bands, boom boxes, car stereos, lawn mowers, leaf blowers, desktop printers, un-muffled motorcycles, passenger jets, and the incessant beeps, chirps, and chimes from cell phones, computers, automobile instrument panels, PDA's, elevators, trucks backing up, etc. In other words, if Noise is a satanic device, Satan has made *many more* great strides since Screwtape's boast. We need some silence – and we will not have it unless we take action.

Silence is good just for its own sake, just for the relief that it brings – just for the pleasantness and peace that come in a quiet moment. But silence is also important because to gain it we must be still, we must find a space of stillness and rest, and therein we are able, finally, to hear the still, small voice of the Lord. We have important decisions to make almost daily – a great need for the Lord's direction and guidance, but often His voice is buried in the avalanche of Noise in our lives. The “qualms, scruples and desires” Screwtape refers to are the Lord speaking – but so often we can't hear Him over the din.

As a result of the clergy retreat, your pastoral staff is starting our Tuesday afternoon prayer time with 15 minutes of silence. Will you join us in making at least a small place for silence, for stillness before the Lord? Advent is upon us – the season of preparing our hearts to celebrate the coming of Jesus – first as a baby born in Bethlehem 2,000 years ago, and His coming again, His final return. In our noisy, hectic lives, I am suggesting that we cannot really prepare at all apart from silence. It is only in silence that we hear; it is only in hearing Him that we grow and change. I pray that we will all make a space for stillness, silence and hearing – both during Advent, and in the years to come.

## Vestry Update

**Vestry Update:** At the November meeting the Vestry reviewed bids for the repair of the Preschool Building (inside and outside walls to be partially replaced due to extensive water damage), and approved contracting with one of the bidders. These repairs are expected to consume most of our capital account reserves. We also reviewed our actual receipts and expenses to date, and began the process of developing our 2011 budget. We also voted to move monies from certain “temporarily restricted” and dormant accounts into either the operating or capital accounts so that they could be applied against expenses.

Further, we discussed the status of the “hearing loop” project, which is the installation of a wire loop in the floor of the church, which loop would transmit an inaudible electronic signal received by certain types of hearing aides, allowing wearers of those devices to hear the service. We also discussed the savings achieved to date in our budgeted expenses, and the range of budget deficits nevertheless possible, considering our reduced receipts in 2010.

We reviewed the changes needed to our by-laws and constitution to reflect our current size, structure, and the need for having a certain level of involvement in parish life in order to run for Vestry or to be a delegate to Convention. Finally, the Vestry (*sans* staff) spent about an hour with consultant Peter Mitchell developing the Vestry's views on Prince George Parish's *strengths, weaknesses, opportunities* and *threats* (SWOT). Peter had previously taken the staff through the same exercise, and now, with the Vestry's input, he will begin meeting with *focus groups* in the congregation to collect the congregation's views on the same. This process is intended to help us develop a vision for Prince George, and particularly what our ministries in our community should, or could, look like.

## Tithing In Hard Times – Count It All Joy

The Biblical standard of giving, and the standard adopted in our Diocese and by our Vestry, is *the tithe* – 10% – giving 10% of your income to your church, and the church gives 10% to the Diocese, and the Diocese gives away 10% outside its borders for ministry. It's called “the 10-10-10 rule” and it is simple, elegant and powerfully effective.

The beauty of the tithe is all the more evident in difficult economic times, for if our income as individuals or as a parish or diocese should go down, so does our gift – 10% of less is less – and if our income goes up, so does our giving. It's called “proportional giving”, and it works well. The good thing about tough economic times, reduced incomes, depleted savings, cut budgets, lower standards of living, and the like, is that they offer us all a *unique opportunity* to put our faith to the test – to trust the Lord and see Him faithful to meet our needs – which is all joy. That is His promise in Scripture – that is His unique invitation: Trust Me in this, He says – bring in the full tithe, the full 10% – *test* Me in this, He says, and watch Me open the floodgates of heaven and pour out on you so much you will not have room to store it (Mal. 3:8-12).

This is why when the Vestry, at the start of 2010 decided to reduce staff compensation, some staff families actually *increased* their giving back to the parish, both the percentage (above 10%) and the absolute dollars. We believe with all our hearts that we cannot out-give God, and that the only way – *ever* – to have enough is to give more, which is all the more true and important in hard times, and all the more a source of joy. That's our encouragement to you: *find the joy* of tithing – the simple joy of doing what God asks, the great joy of receiving God's abundance and blessing when you trust Him like that, and the unmatched joy of always having what you need and more besides.




## Christmas Day Prince Frederick



## You're Gonna Have To Serve Somebody

“But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD.” Joshua 24:15

Are you Christian-ish? Or do you follow other gods?

For many today, Christianity is only a ticket to heaven that they keep in their wallets. They can take it out to show people when necessary, but otherwise keep it hidden. Christianity for them is a club not a covenant. Where is God in your life? Who are you serving?

No matter who you are, you are going to serve someone. There are two ways to live. One is to follow God's way and the other is to reject God's way and to live under another master. God is creator of all things and He has a plan and purpose for you. The devil has a plan to get you to reject and turn from God's plan. In the Garden of Eden, there were two differing ideas- the first was that God was good and his way was best. The devil came along and said, “No, God is lying. He is trying to hold you back, but you can be like God and decide right and wrong.” The first people chose to serve the devil.

Through the Ten Commandments God gives a basic structure for society, where God is first and family is central. Both of these essential needs are becoming lost in society. Christian Smith, a sociologist said that “a significant part of Christianity in the United States is actually only tenuously Christian in the sense that it is seriously connected to the actual historical Christian tradition.” This is alongside many marriages and families breaking down. This generation may look more like primates than the humans God made us to be. Sadly, many in the Episcopal church have been the worst offenders of the problems listed above. However, our tradition is rich. The prayer book has a daily reading plan and family devotions. Who told you to reject God's word which tells us to keep God and family a priority? Who will you serve?

Many youth today don't even think about God when it comes to decisions. For many, their intellects are used for getting around their parents rather than for family unity. Their friends are valued over the people that love and know them much better than their friends. They push their families aside to go to parties or have relationships. God is our most loving and knowing parent, and he put the tree of morality in the center of the garden. This tree shows us the right way and gave us the chance to follow God's basic structures for society. Parents long to give good things to their children and want to offer what's best for them. So to the youth today, I say be careful who you serve because no matter what you do, you're gonna have to serve somebody.
