Dear Friends,

“God is in charge.” How often do we hear this said, and say it ourselves – and yet I wonder, do we really live as though it is true? Don’t we mostly live as though we are in charge, as though we control the outcome, and life is really just what we make it, that it’s all up to us?

I think some of us were feeling that way about our future in the Episcopal Church (TEC) – that we had taken such a strong stand against the direction and actions of TEC that TEC could not let our Bishop Mark Lawrence remain a bishop. Perhaps we had forgotten that God is in charge – and this past week He reminded us, for in a surprising move TEC’s Disciplinary Board for Bishops (DBB), which has been considering charges against Bishop Lawrence, has now decided that the charges do not amount to his abandonment of the Church and so those charges are now dropped. This does not mean that other charges cannot be filed – they may well be, based on recent actions by the Diocese to recognize formally each parish’s ownership of its own property free from trust interests of the Diocese or of TEC. But it seems the Lord has averted the immediate threat to our Bishop, and provided us all with a timely and encouraging reminder of Who is in charge.

I say a timely reminder for we have just begun our season of Advent, the season of remembering that God is in charge. It’s the season for preparing for the celebration of Christmas, His birth as a human being – God breaking into this world to take charge of sin and death, taking human likeness upon Himself to deliver us from the ravages of our own rebellion. And it’s the season for preparing for Christ’s second coming when, at the end of time, He will take charge of the whole created order, all dominion and authority will reside in Him, He will establish a new heaven and new earth, and we will be gathered to Him forever. God has always been in charge, and we are moving inexorably toward a final resolution, a final judgment, wherein all who are in Christ will inherit the Kingdom He has prepared for us.

And I say an encouraging reminder because remembering that He is in charge is a great stress-reliever – in fact, it’s the only great stress-reliever. In this in-between time, between His “already came” as a baby and His “not-yet return” as King, Jesus told us to cast our cares on Him for He cares for us; He told us to be anxious for nothing, not even for the essentials of life (food, drink, clothing) – for our Heavenly Father will provide for us; He told us that He will work all things together for our good if we will trust in Him and follow His call upon our lives. So, whatever our circumstances this Advent season, let’s be encouraged! God is in charge! He has done great things on our behalf, He will provide all things necessary for our good, and He will bear our cares if we will turn them over to Him. Let it be part of our preparations this Advent season to remember Who is in charge, and so to be anxious for nothing.


Adult Ed: December

The videos will be two more in the series we've been watching – beautifully shot on location in Egypt with great Bible teaching by Ray VanDerlaan on God's rescue of His people Israel from slavery in Egypt. Implementing the Vision

The second Sunday of the new year (Jan. 8th) during the 10:10 AM Adult Education time, we will be developing our plan to implement the new vision for Prince George. 40 Days of Love is designed for small group discussion. Rick Warren teaches that learning to love God and others is to be our highest goal, our greatest aim, our first priority, our deepest aspiration, our strongest ambition, our constant focus, our passionate intention, and our dominant life value. The more we learn how to love authentically, the more we become like Jesus. The study relates directly to the Vision Statement for Prince George Winyah Episcopal Church which emphasizes being a "Loving Church." Rick Warren's *Purpose Driven Life* was one of our most popular adult education programs, so

40 Days of Love promises to be another engaging opportunity to grow in our faith and in our outreach to others.

Vestry Nominations and Annual Meeting

Our annual meeting will be held **Sunday afternoon, January, 22nd at 5:00 pm**. At this meeting we elect three new wardens, vestry members and delegates to Diocesan Convention. The wardens and vestry of Prince George meet monthly to share in the spiritual leadership of the parish as well as to make financial and business decisions for the church, and to confer on matters of worship and program.

The senior and junior wardens are elected for one-year terms, and may be re-elected for second terms. The vestry has nine members, with staggered terms of three years. This year Dave Starnes (senior warden), Laura Gates, Scott Marlowe, Andy Roberts and Andy Crocker (junior warden) will rotate off the vestry; they also make up the nominating committee for the upcoming election. Because Dave Starnes and Andy Crocker have served two years as senior and junior warden respectively, they are ineligible for election to the vestry until January, 2013.

Please prayerfully consider members of the church you believe would make good wardens or vestry members and submit their names to the nominating committee *no later than December 10th*. In order to allow for the publication of nominees' biographical information, and to ensure a level field at the Annual Meeting, no nominations will be accepted after that date and no nominations from the floor will be accepted.


Bishop's Visitation and Reaffirmation of Faith Sunday, December 4th

Book Recommendations:




ECW Bible Study

The Case for Christ – Lee Strobel

Is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God?

For many there has been little question, that Jesus is who He says He is in the Bible. But increasingly, others have questions about the veracity of His claims and the truth of the Bible itself. Retracing his own spiritual journey from atheism to faith, Lee Strobel, former legal editor of the Chicago Tribune, cross-examines several experts who are recognized authorities in their own fields. Strobel challenges them with questions like:



- How reliable is the New Testament?
- Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible?
- Is there any reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?

Strobel's tough, point-blank questions make this DVD study a captivating, and riveting quest for the truth about history's most compelling figure.

NOTES FROM THE CHOIR LOFT

Angels and angels

I would like to begin with a request. This year, please make time to come to our annual *Messiah* event **and** bring a friend, neighbor or family member who does not yet know or love Christ.

You might reasonably ask - Why? Well because whilst the choir and musicians offer *Messiah* as an act of worship for the glory of God and would do so even without an audience or congregation, the event has another dimension. Through the music and speech, the Word of God is clearly proclaimed, so it is an opportunity for the people of Prince George to reach out to those who don't know Christ. Of course, you could make an invitation to come to any church event, but I believe many people who for whatever reason would not want to come to a regular church service, might just take your invitation to here this amazing message through music.

We are just starting the season of Advent – a time of preparation with two foci. The first is preparation to celebrate the historic birth of Christ. The second is preparation for the imminent return of Christ. Preparation for the return of Christ is not just personal, but includes the Church, and the world.

Our Sunday lectionary is filled with accounts of messengers sent to tell God's people to get ready. The Old Testament prophets brought words of impending judgment, but also the salvation to come through the Messiah. Angels announced the news of the Savior to Mary, and then later to Joseph and finally to the shepherds. John the Baptist preached a message of repentance to the people of Israel.

The Lord knows how quickly people become complacent about Him, and with that complacency comes disobedience and a falling away. He had to send a stream of prophets, and then Jesus who came with parables of wise and foolish virgins, and a household that ran out of food, and a man who tries to crash a wedding.

Even after the church was born at Pentecost and with first hand experience of Christ, the apostles had to keep steering the church back on track.

One of our complacencies is in sharing the Good News. We make up all kinds of excuses for not doing it. We're too busy with other (good, right and proper) things, we don't feeling worthy or qualified, we're worried we will be ridiculed . . . the list is long and for sometimes even includes Episcopalians don't do that.

Whilst evangelism is a command of Jesus (Go, tell), the motivation for evangelism (telling the Good News) can only come from inside. However much external encouragement or pressure is applied, if you don't *know the truth* and it hasn't *set you free*, (John 8: 31) there is nothing to share. But if you do know the truth, ask the Lord of the Harvest to set you free to share it. He alone, through the Holy Spirit can equip you, strengthen you and direct you.

The root of the word Angel means messenger. One of the characteristics of angelic encounters in scripture is that they tend to be brief and not involve a long explanation. Something is announced or declared or an invitation is made, then the angels return to heaven.

This Advent and Christmas be an angel – a messenger - to those around you. Make the invitation to hear the Good News of the birth of Christ. You don't need a collar or a seminary degree – just the confidence to know that you are sent by God to people who desperately need to know the Savior, and Jesus has promised to be with you.

We offer *Messiah* as an opportunity for you to reach out and bring someone to hear the Good News that *people that walk in darkness can see a great light*, and that on those living in the *land of the shadow of death a light has dawned*.

YOUTH NEWS

We have been working through the book of Revelation with the high school students. We recently taught on Revelation 12; the woman and the dragon, which most scholars agree is telling of Satan's attack on Jesus as He is born of Israel. This child was to be a ruler; a king- the messiah. Despite the attacks of the dragon (or Satan) the child is rescued and snatched up to heaven. The following scene is of an epic battle in the heavenlies between the archangel Michael and his armies, and Satan and his. Satan loses the battle and is cast out of heaven. There is then a great cry in Heaven, "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Christ. The defeat of Satan in this epic battle has been won we are told by the blood of the lamb, and the word of testimony of those who have been saved. There is a rejoicing in heavens, for the accuser, has been thrown down. The one who stood in the throne room of God, condemning God's people, saying, "you need to fulfill your judgment on sin. Look at what they did. You need to judge them- you need to kill them. Remember, you said, 'If they eat of the tree, they will surely die.'" But Satan has lost all power to accuse. He has been thrown out of Heaven. Jesus holds the keys to death and hades. Freedom has been bought at the price of divine blood. The kingdom of God is now, and will one day come in its fullness.

There is a bitter end to the section, however. Satan has been cast out of heaven, but he is cast down to earth. He is filled with fury for he knows his time is short. After the death of Christ and his ascension, all that's left is for Christ to come back in glory to judge humanity and to destroy Satan. The picture we are given in the following chapter is of Satan seeking to destroy God's people, just as he sought to destroy the baby boy in Bethlehem. As Christians, we are in a war. Those being confirmed, join the ranks of soldiers for Christ's kingdom. We have a fierce, defeated enemy, seeking to claim all that he can before his

time ends. Will we stand with Christ? Will we live in light of his battle, a life that honors Christ? Will we identify with the blood of the lamb, dying to ourselves and our sinful desires and let his life reign in us? Will we stand together in Christ and proclaim, "He is our salvation, and the gates of hell will not overcome his church." Let us remember the light that pierces the darkness this Christmas, and shine that light brightly.
