We concluded our third ten-week Adult Information/New Members class with the reception of a mother and her two children, ages 10 and 13, as members of Shepherd of the City. While our growth has been measured in small steps, we have seen increased interest in classes from current members as well people inquiring 'off the street.'

Youth Corps Pilot

Last August 11-17, the LC-MS Office of Youth Ministry collaborated with Philadelphia Lutheran Ministries to launch its **Lutheran Youth Corps** pilot program on-site at Shepherd. Thirteen young adults (ages 16 to 20), along with four LC-MS pastors, spent a week in NE Philly.

Each day began with morning prayer and a pot of coffee and the week ended with Divine Service.

Neighborhood Canvas

Rev Carlos Hernandez presented a program to systematically research a community's needs called *Gospel Seeds.* The youth and pastors later went into the neighborhood to introduce themselves to residents and local businesses, asking people about community needs. Reduced attendees: Brandon, age 10, son of a new member (Dec 3), an infant, Savannah (Dec 14), and Marlon, affectionately known as "Tank," the young son of a new member (Dec 21).

During December, we also had an Advent dinner and prayer service mid-week. Most regular Sunday attendees made it for our midweek services, and we grew together through our time of fellowship and evening prayer. We held both Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services to celebrate the joyous incarnation of our Savior.

Since Epiphany, we have been holding another Adult Information class with four potential new adult members, who also bring three young children.

Finally, we will welcome two outside congregations for community outreach in February and March. One group will assist with a community dinner and the other, a work day to enhance the property.

crime and child supervision (afterschool care) were needs repeated by many in the neighborhood.

Mercy and Service

Rev Steve Schave presented to the group an overview of the "Theology of Mercy," and Rev Ross Johnson provided information about the synod's Disaster Relief. Then followed a property work day.

Thursday was a full day of off-site service organization visits: (a) to Eliza Shirley House, a women's shelter, to interact with residents and their children; (b) to famous Love Park to pass out food bags to the homeless; (c) to a retirement home called Paul's Run.

The week embodied our confession of faith through *Witness, Mercy and Life Together.* Our son, Knox, still affectionately refers to the youth as "our friends." We hope to work with these Youth Corps friends again.
