Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ and with your church in all the world. Like the first followers of Jesus, fill us with the awe and wonder of your presence as we devote ourselves to your teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and prayer, sharing what we have and giving to those who are in need.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever. Amen.




