Tips and Tricks:

...Through Who He has Sent

In the sermon we said "testing has been the name of the game." How have Joseph's brother's finally passed the test?

God provides reconciliation, writing a new story over the old story of strife. After revealing himself, Joseph embraces his brothers. Why did Joseph wait until this moment?
