## Tips and Tricks:

Compare the problems of the church in Thyatira to the church in Pergamum, how are they different?

The problem with Thyatria, and often with us, is that Christ no longer seems like He is "enough", like something else needs to be added on.

The Promise:  Christ promises that he who overcomes will rule the nations. What does that have to do with the problems they are facing?		
What is Christ's exhortation to the church (see v. 25)?		
What is Christ's promised reward- the Morningstar? (Read Revelation 22:16)		
Christ is both the power by which we endure, and the reward we have for enduring.		
How have you seen glimpses of that reward in this life?
