

BRINGING FAMILIES TOGETHER ONE MEAL AT A TIME


Sharing a meal together at The Mustard Seed has become a family tradition for Crystal and Mike. For the couple, the 96th Street Building is a safe haven they can turn to for quality time with their three boys and one-month-old baby girl. The family says they are very grateful for the time they can spend together during the meal program.

"I would say let's go to The Seed tonight and the kids would be like okay! Because they love it over here," says Crystal.

Crystal and Mike met at The Mustard Seed's New Year's Eve celebration a few years ago and have since been inseparable.

"When I met Mike, I was a struggling single mom of three boys that just came out of a very bad marriage and Mike was looking to get his life together after being released from prison," admitted Crystal.

Although Mike works part-time, the couple still struggle to pay their bills and buy necessities such as groceries and supplies for their four children. Thankfully for their family, The Mustard Seed has been a huge support system.

"We go to the food bank at The Mustard Seed to help with groceries, use PAC sometimes for clothes, and come to the evening meal program which has helped us out a whole lot," says Crystal.

Providing for their children is the first priority for the couple, as Crystal remembers being forced to move her children eight times in one year as a result of issues she had in her previous marriage.

"My oldest boy said 'mom, I am scared to make any friends because every time I make a new friend we have to leave', so I promised we will make it work this time until they finish school," says Crystal.

For Mike, it is the environment and friendly staff at the 96th Street Building that assures him it is a safe place to bring his family.

"As long as I am with Crystal and the kids when they come to the meal program I am happy to bring them here. The staff here are awesome. These guys always help us out."

Being a family man is a new concept for Mike as he admits he never really had a family growing up. After losing their four-month-old baby to SIDS a couple of years ago, he is determined to provide the best family life he can for Crystal and the kids.

"Last year was the first time I ever spent Christmas with any family. I am looking forward to doing that again this year," says Mike happily.



A NEW SPACE FOR OUR NEIGHBOURS

In June 2018, The Mustard Seed relocated the Neighbour Centre from 104 Street to 81 Avenue. The new space offers participants a variety of resources, including meals, clothing, laundry, foot care, and community programming. For individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty in south Edmonton, the Neighbour Centre is the only adult drop-in.
