They are adapt at turning out breakfast for the multitudes and accomplish it quickly and efficiently. Our breakfast guests are also teachers and give me thoughts to ponder. I will share a couple of instances that come to mind.


One morning I was serving porridge beside another volunteer who was serving pancakes. She greeted one of the guests by name and he was so surprised that she knew his name and even queried how she did. She said with a smile that she had been coming a long time and that he had too. After he finished his breakfast, he passed by the serving line once again to express his amazement. I tucked that away to reflect on later or I would have shed tears in the porridge. It is such a human longing to be known and called by name. God knows that and says to each of us, "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine." (Isaiah 43:1)

Another instance is a difficult reminder to me of how little understanding I truly have of the circumstances of our guests. We had some pancakes left over at closing time which we bagged and then offered until they ran out. I, without thinking, asked one gentleman if he would like some pancakes to take home and he said "I don't have a home." All I could come up with was a sincere "I'm sorry" but with a mental note to offer "pancakes to go" instead next time. My slip of wording and his comment still hurts my heart.

Recently, there was a brief lull in the serving line that allowed time to gaze from the kitchen across the guests eating breakfast at the tables in the dining area. My eyes rested on a gentleman whose profile was a younger version of our son in facial similarity and he captured my attention. The realizations that with different life situations that could be my son sitting there and also that he was indeed someone's son, made a wave of tenderness and compassion flow over me for our guests.

I am asking God to help me follow the perfect example of Jesus in loving and serving others and to forgive my shortcomings. I am grateful and humbled by this new opportunity to learn and grow at the Rock.
