II – O Adonai; Whose Mighty Arm stretches out in Good News

VI - O King of Nations; who bids divisions & binds hearts

O King of the nations, and their desire, you are the cornerstone which makes all one.

O Come and save the human race whom you fashioned from clay. Come, Lord Jesus.

Waiting for O, Emmanuel A service of Lessons, Carols and Prayers

Tonight's Christmas Eve service is based upon ancient Advent prayers called the "O Antiphons".

The words may date back to a community of fifth-century Jewish Christians and perhaps was part of their Hanukkah festival. The seven "O Antiphons" we have today were developed by Benedictine monks in the Middle Ages. Based on Isaiah's prophecies about Jesus, each one begins with the beseeching "O" and then addresses Christ using a particular title (Wisdom, Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Dayspring, King, Emmanuel). We often pray these prayers ourselves when we sing the ancient hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel. The order of the prayers is significant. Starting with the last title in reverse order, the first letter of each (Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapienta) forms an acrostic: the Latin words Ero cras, which speak Jesus' response and promise to us. "Tomorrow, I will come."
