2) Commitment Form - Follow the above directions then click Membership Commitment Form.

3) Elder Interview

- You will meet with two elders or an elder and deacon.

- It provides an opportunity for our elders to have special prayer for the prospective member

4) Covenant Affirmation

- Publicly affirm the Church covenant with the congregation and all other new RSC members.
- To take place during a combined Sunday morning gathering.

What is Church Membership?

Is Church Membership Biblical? Let me ask it this way - is a commitment to a identifiable, specific group a Biblical model? Yes. **5 clear proofs** of local church membership in the apostolic era.

(1) Church membership is indicated the charge to corporate gatherings.

Hebrews 10:23-25

23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; 24 and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, 25 not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.

1 Corinthians 14:23

23 Therefore if the whole church assembles together

1 Timothy 5:3-16

3 Honor widows who are widows indeed; [Paul is concerned about a select group of people here.]

4 but if any widow has children or grandchildren, they must first learn to practice piety in regard to their own family and to make some return to their parents; for this is acceptable in the sight of God.

5 Now she who is a widow indeed and who has been left alone, has fixed her hope on God and continues in entreaties and prayers night and day.

6 But she who gives herself to wanton pleasure is dead even while she lives.

7 Prescribe these things as well, so that they may be above reproach.

8But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

9A widow is to be put on the list only if she is not less than sixty years old [on the list? - sounds like an organized group of people huh?], having been the wife of one man,

10having a reputation for good works; and if she has brought up children, if she has shown hospitality to strangers, if she has washed the saints' feet, if she has assisted those in distress, and if she has devoted herself to every good work.

James 5:13-16

13Is anyone among you suffering? Then he must pray Is anyone cheerful? He is to sing praises.

14Is anyone among you sick? Then he must call for the elders of the church [which church - the one among you] and they are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord;

15and the prayer offered in faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he has committed sins, they will be forgiven him. 16Therefore, confess your sins to one another [who is the one another - those among you], and pray for one another so that you may be healed The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much.

14Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. 15Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

16Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly Do not be wise in your own estimation.

It is our desire to not overwhelm our members with activities for the sake of tradition or expectations. We intentionally limit what we ask you to engage in corporately so that you can be freed to be involved in your communities and organizations as ambassadors for Jesus Christ. With this in mind, here are some of our primary areas we engage in together at Randolph Street.

1. Gatherings

- Weekly Worship Gathering

Our weekly times of worship serve as the foundation of our Church's calendar.

- After-Gathering

Following our weekly Gatherings, refreshments are provided to encourage our people to interact with visitors and fellowship with each other.

- Life Together

The first Sunday of each month at 9:45 [in place of our regular Training Hour] our church family meets to get updates on missions and ministries within our church. It is also a time to pray for one another.

Wide-spread participation in these volunteer opportunities is vital to ensure all roles are filled.

4. Small Groups

The purpose of our small group ministry is to give a format for families and individuals to meet during the week for fellowship, care, prayer, accountability, and the study of God's Word.

- Long-term Small Groups

These small groups will form based on relationships, geography, etc. and will meet in someone's home or at one of our Campus locations.

- Short-term Small Groups

These small groups are focused on specific needs, gender groups, age groups, etc. and will typically meet for a specified period of time.

5. Care Groups

Every member at RSBC is assigned to a Care Group with its own deacon and elder. These Care Groups exist so that no member's needs are overlooked, whether physical or spiritual.

- Providing meals following a birth or death in the family
