

Prayer Guide Hebrews 4:14 – 5:10

June 23, 2019

Accept the challenge of reading through the book of Hebrews each week during this sermon series.

We invite you to join Redeemer in praying through the book of Hebrews as well.

Because Jesus is our great high priest, we can draw near to God in prayer.

Read Hebrews 4:14 – 5:10

Pray as the Holy Spirit leads.

Jesus is our Great High Priest, through Him we have direct access to God.

Be thankful that we have a great high priest, Jesus, whom we acknowledge as God. v. 4:14

Remember when you are tempted, that Jesus was also tempted understands our weaknesses. v. 15

Approach the throne of God with confidence as you pray, you will find mercy, grace and help. v. 16

Recognize that Jesus was chosen by God to be the sacrifice for our sin. v. 5:1

Consider, the earthly priest, appointed by God, from among men, who is supposed to deal gently with those who sin, the ignorant and the wayward, like himself. Who also had to offer sacrifice for his own sin. v. 2-4

Express gratitude that God appointed His own Son to be our high priest. v. 5

Understand that Jesus is our priest forever, his sacrifice is eternal. v. 6

Pay attention to how Jesus prayed. v. 7

He offered up prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to God.
Jesus' prayers were heard because of his reverence, his respect and love for God.

Accept the challenge to pray as Jesus prayed, passionately and reverently.

Learn obedience through suffering, prayer through suffering yields a closer relationship with God. v. 8

Rejoice that Jesus, being made perfect, became the source of eternal salvation for those who obey Him. v. 9

Remember, God designated Jesus as a high priest, giving us direct access to God through Him. v. 10

Music allows us to be in tune with God when we pray.
