 - a. How do the respective changed lives of the witnesses attest to the resurrection?
 - b. What alternative theories are put out to try to counter the resurrection? In what ways do they come up short?
 - c. Simon Greenleaf said "the Resurrection is one of the best supported events in history, according to the laws of legal evidence administered in courts of justice." Do you think this is true?
- 4. According to this passage, what is the result of the fact that Christ was resurrected?
 - a. What are firsfruits?
 - b. Is the resurrection at the heart of your Christian witness why or why not?
 - c. What role does the resurrection play in influencing how you live out your Christian life? How should it?
