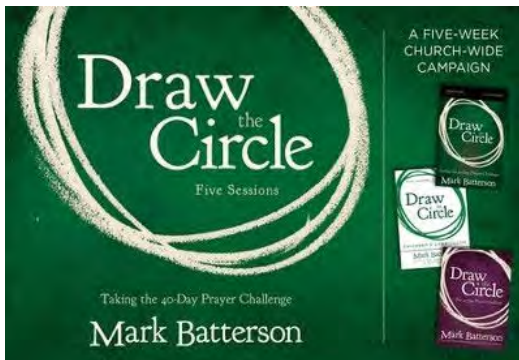
DRAW THE CIRCLE, TAKE THE CHALLENGE!

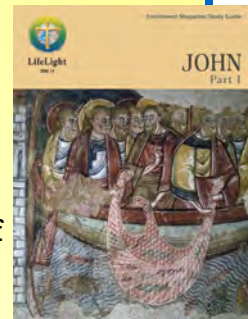

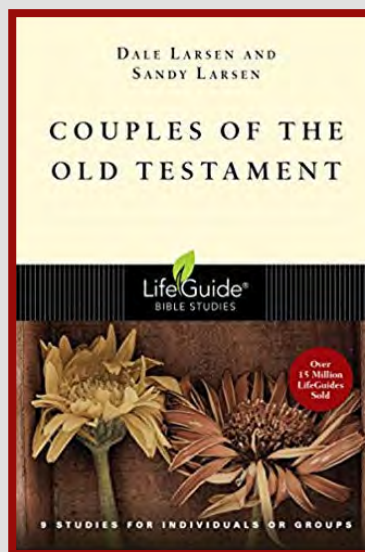
