January 23, 2021 – Third Sunday after Epiphany

Season of the Cross: Green for Ordinary Time

The Season after Epiphany is one of two periods in the Church calendar known as "ordinary time;" and it runs from Epiphany until Ash Wednesday. During Epiphany we focus on the mission of the Church to reach all the peoples of the earth, and the great gift of God's grace in revealing the Light to the world.

Call to Worship: Based on Ephesians 1

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

Leader: To the Father who has given us every spiritual blessing in Christ.

ALL: We give praise and glory!

Leader: To the Son through whom we have redemption, forgiveness, and the riches of God's grace.

Leader: To the Spirit that seals us in His promise, the guarantee of our inheritance until we possess it.

Song of Ascent

The first song we sing together guides us as we "go up" or approach the presence of God to worship Him. This song is meant to rouse us to worship and awaken our hearts.

Reading of the Law: Genesis 15:1, 6

While the law cannot justify us or make us righteous; it is a teacher given to lead us to Christ, the fulfiller of the law.

After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision: "Fear not, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great."... And he believed the LORD, and he counted it to him as righteousness.

Prayer of Adoration and Confession

We pray together, praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Song of Repentance

In this song of repentance we acknowledge our sin and our need of a Savior.

Assurance of Pardon: Romans 9:15-16; 11:33-36

We read God's Word together and are reminded that grace and mercy are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

For he says to Moses, "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." So then it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God, who has mercy... Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! "For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?" "Or who has given a gift to him that he might be repaid?" For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen.
