## Coalition of Ministries Helping Those Struggling With and Impacted by Sexual Sin Adds Key Staff, Sets Conference

Karen Eaglin, the group's new executive administrator, served for more than 10 years as project manager for Focus on the Family's public policy division, where she handled the day-to-day and on-site details of the organization's Love Won Out conferences at which Paulk frequently spoke. Eaglin has also worked as program director for the Glen Eyrie Group, which operates The Navigators; and as marketing project manager for Charis Bible College.

Joining her on the RHN team is Judy Preciado, also an alumnus of Focus on the Family, who will serve as conference coordinator. She is responsible for planning and staging the HOPE 2019 annual conference, to be held June 21-22 in Minneapolis. Preciado has extensive event planning and marketing experience dating back to the more than 20 years she spent at Focus.

Rounding out the new additions is Gary Schneeberger, Focus on the Family's former vice president of communications under both Dr. James Dobson and current president Jim Daly. Schneeberger's work at Focus included handling all communications for Love Won Out. In 2016, Schneeberger founded his own PR firm, ROAR, which has been tasked with handling all communications and PR needs for RHN.
