

Give Yourself to God

Psalm 40

Sermon Theme: Jesus gave himself to God by becoming a sacrifice, and he waited on the Lord for deliverance through resurrection. All who are in Him by faith must give themselves to Him the same way and wait for the same deliverance.

- I. The Praise & Hope of King David (Psalm 40:1-17)
 - A. His thankful praise for past deliverance v. 1-10
 1. He remembers deliverance from the pit v.1-3
 2. He extols God's countless saving wonders v.4-5
 3. He gives himself to God in obedience v.6-8
 4. He proclaims glad tidings of God's salvation v.9-10
 - B. His confident hope for future deliverance v. 11-17
 1. He pleads for compassion in his helpless state v. 11-12
 2. He asks God to deliver him & judge his enemies v.13-15
 3. He pleads for swift deliverance from his affliction v.16-17
- II. The Praise & Hope of King Jesus
 - A. David's past deliverance prophetically pictures Christ's deliverance
 1. Jesus was truly raised from the pit of death
 2. Jesus truly performed God's countless saving wonders
 3. Jesus gave himself to God as a sacrifice (Heb 10:1-10)
 4. Jesus proclaimed glad tidings of God's salvation (Luke 4:18-19)
 - B. David's future hope prophetically voices Christ's hope for resurrection
 1. Jesus pleaded for compassion in his helpless state (Luke 22:39-46)
 2. Jesus asked God to deliver him (Hebrews 5:7)
 3. Jesus *WILL* judge his enemies (Revelation 19:11-16)
 4. Jesus was awarded swift deliverance on the third day (Acts 10:40-43)
