Confession of Sin

All confess their sin using John Calvin's Genevan liturgy

Lord God, eternal and Almighty Father,

We confess and acknowledge without pretense before your Holy Majesty, that we are poor and miserable sinners, conceived and born in iniquity and corruption; prone to do what is evil, incapable of any good; and that in our depravity, we endlessly transgress your holy laws.

Have mercy upon us for this wickedness, we ask, in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. And as you blot out our vices and blemishes, extend and increase the graces of the Holy Spirit so that the corruption of sin might be overcome and defeated. Through Jesus Christ our Lord,

Confession of Faith - Westminster Shorter Catechism, Q93, 96-97

All confess their faith using the Shorter Catechism. Phil asks the question, all respond in bold

Q. 93. Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?

The sacraments of the New Testament are, two only, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper, and these take the place of Circumcision and the Passover in the Old Testament

Q. 96. What is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper is a sacrament in which, by giving and receiving bread and wine according to Christ's appointment, his death is proclaimed, and those who receive rightly are by faith (and not by the mouth in a physical manner) made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace.

Q. 97. What is required to receive rightly the Lord's Supper?

It is required of those who would receive rightly the Lord's Supper, that they examine themselves as to their knowledge of the meaning and object of this sacrament, their faith to feed upon Christ, and their repentance, love and new obedience; for coming in an unworthy manner would bring judgement on themselves.
