Lent Application

1. Fasting: Consider some good gift to give up to focus greater delight on the giver of the gift rather than the gift itself. Most often people fast by giving up some sort of food item, you could consider giving up some other gift you enjoy regularly such as coffee, television, social media, etc. See the Dr. Martyn Lloyd Jones quote below:

"Fasting means abstinence from food for the sake of certain special purposes such as prayer or meditation or the seeking of God for some peculiar reason or under some exceptional circumstances...

To make the matter complete, we would add that fasting, if we conceive of it truly, must not only be confined to the question of food and drink; fasting should really be made to include abstinence from anything which is legitimate in and of itself for the sake of some special spiritual purpose. There are many bodily functions which are right and normal and perfectly legitimate, but which for special peculiar reasons in certain circumstances should be controlled. That is fasting."

2. Serving: Who can you love and serve sacrificially during this Lent Season as Jesus loved and served you? Write some ideas about what you can do in your family, neighborhood, work, school. What might this service cost you?

3. Growing: Consider reading through Isaiah 40-53 as a preparation for Easter (Reading plan on the back). Looking at Galatians 5:19-24 below, which work of the flesh have you struggled with this year, what Fruit of the Spirit do you want to grow in this season? What practical steps can you take to grow in this area? Confess your struggle in this area and seek God's help.

Galatians 5:19-24 "19 Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, ²⁰ idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, ²¹ envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴ And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires."
