

Murders are very uncommon in Newfoundland and Labrador, so our street was very active. We had opportunities to speak with a number of our neighbours and people from the community. Please pray for this man’s family who now have to mourn his death. And pray we can continue to build on the conversations we’re having.



My wife has been able to make some new friends with other moms in the area. There is a playground right behind our house that she frequents with out kids. We're hoping to have some events coming later this Fall.
