



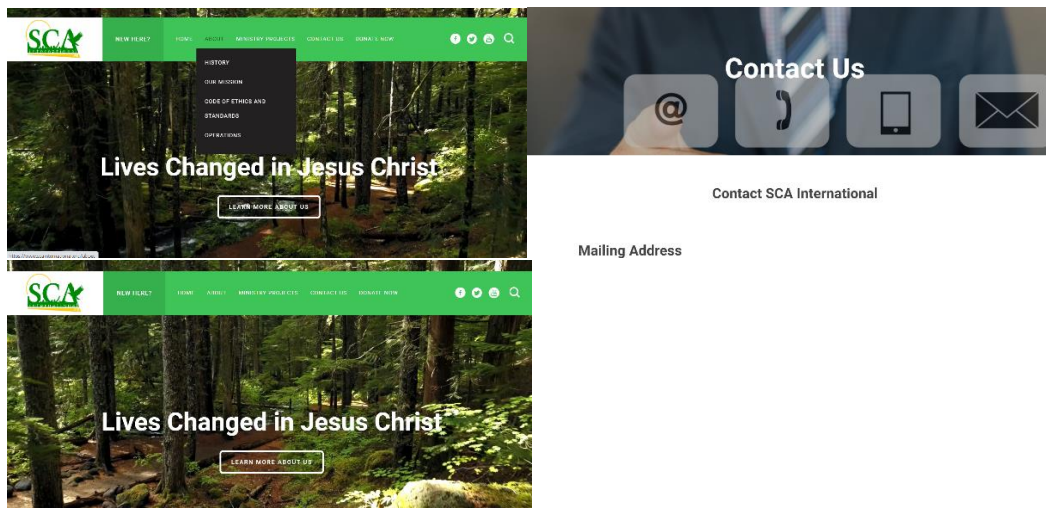
SCA International March 2021 Report

SCA International Website, Social Media

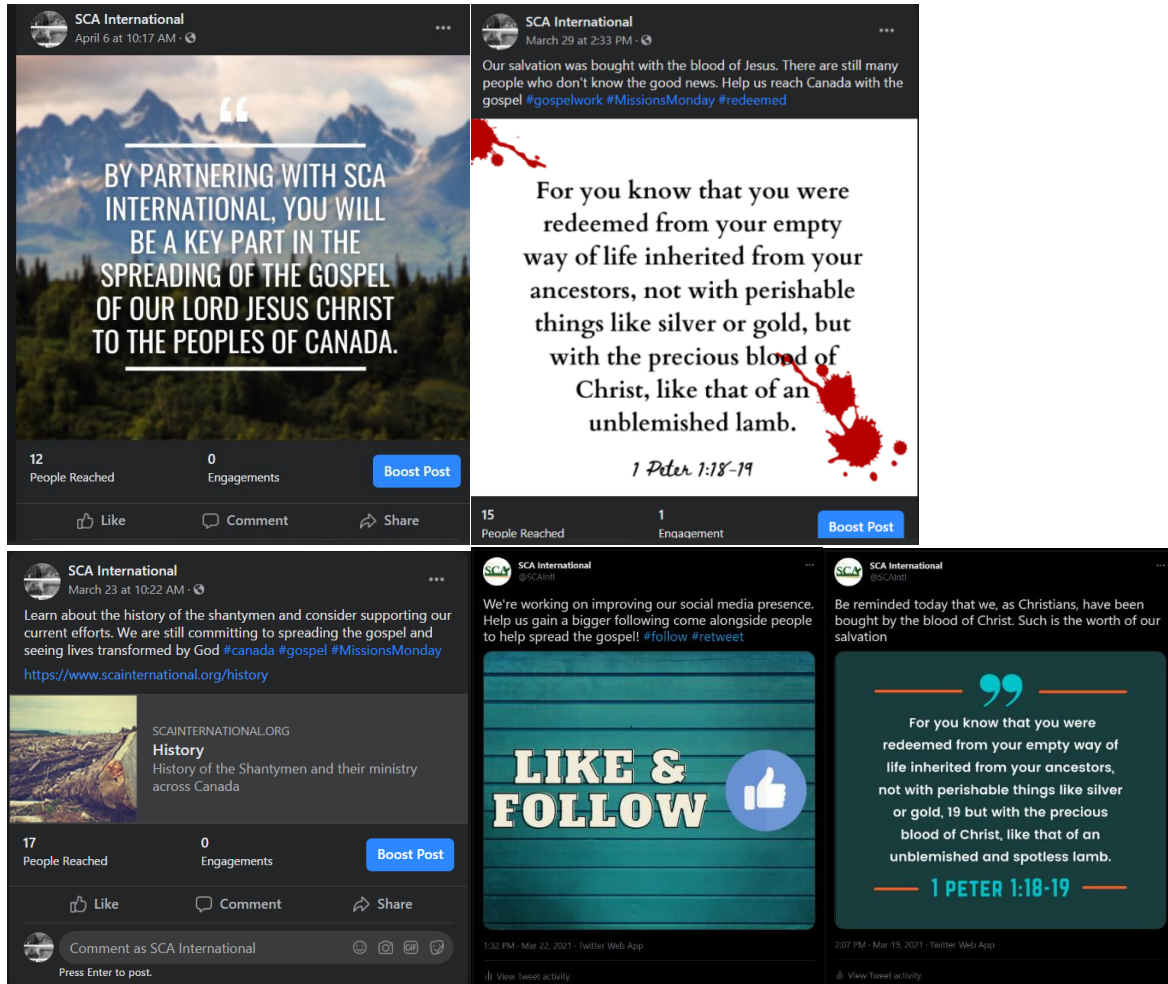

Preaching

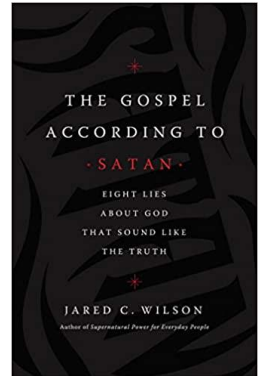
