From the Senior Minister

Louise and I would like to say thank you to all for such a warm welcome to Scots'. In our first two months in Melbourne, even the weather has been magnificent!

So far, we've been on a steep learning curve, and I appreciate your forbearance as things work themselves into a new pattern. I realise if you're a long-time Scots' member that you've had a lot to adjust to as we move out of Covid-mode with the added complexity of a new minister to train 😊.

If things are different, you'll find that sometimes it's because I just don't know how it used to be, and sometimes it's because it's an intentional change. The best thing to do if you're wondering is to simply ask! (For example, you'll find the creed is back this Sunday.)

On the subject of change (for the better), thanks to all those who have commented on the improvements to the sound system over the past couple of weeks. We've had very a useful site visit from a consultant, who identified a number of easily fixed problems. Did you know, for example, that there's meant to be a tiny delay to the audio signal reaching the back speakers, so the sound arrives 'in phase'? For some years, that delay has been set wrongly, which creates a conflicting echo. In addition, the wireless microphones have been operating on the same frequency band as common wi-fi appliances, which means interference and dropouts are more likely. That's easily fixed with an inexpensive new wireless mic.

Also improved is our live stream video to our Facebook page. If you can't make it to church you can tune in and watch live, or pick it up later. The sound is now crisp and clear, both for the music and the preaching. It's much better. From this Sunday we're dipping in to Paul's letter to the Philippians, where we'll be asking the question "Where does real joy come from." The answer will have everything to do with Jesus, and the message of the gospel that inspires Paul's every ambition. Pray that this same gospel will be central for us at Scots' too. "The main thing," says Paul, "is that Christ is preached. And in this I rejoice."

### CHANGES TO ATTENDANCE REGISTRATION FOR SUNDAY

#### **Service registration.**

Victorian COVID 19 regulations require that all people attending worship services use electronic registration. This is typically done on a mobile phone. Please follow these steps.

1. Before coming to Church download the Service Victoria App on to your phone
2. Use the Service Victoria App on your phone to scan the QR codes that are available on entry to the service
  - a. The Scots Church QR code needs to be scanned once per day on the days that you attend Church
  - b. The exception is you attend the 11am and 5pm service on the same day, then you will need to scan both the code for the Church and the Robert White Hall
3. If you are \*unable to scan the QR code, please leave your name and number with the staff person when you enter, they will then scan the QR code on your behalf.



\*We do encourage as many people as possible to use the QR Code to enable a more efficient entry process

#### **We no longer require you to call or email in the week prior to our Church services.**

The only exception to this will be for special events like Christmas and Easter.

We will let you know in advance if you need to pre-register for any event that we think may attract crowds that may exceed our seating capacity.

**Just a reminder about our COVID rules of entry to the Church.**

**Admission requirements**

(You should not attend if there is any change in your status following registration)

- You are free of symptoms including a fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, chills or sweats, shortness of breath, diarrhoea, headache or loss of sense of smell or taste;
- You have not been in contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last two weeks; and
- You have not been directed to isolate.

**Conditions of entry**

- You must comply with any instructions in accordance with the Scots' Church Melbourne COVIDSafe Plan for Public Worship (available in the entrance to the Church);
- You must maintain a safe distance from other attendees at all times; and
- You must take a seat as directed by the attendant .
