For Small Group discussion & application this week:

Identify and list the five instructions on how to pray that Paul gives in verse 18. After each, explain the specific instruction in your own words.

How would you state the main point of this passage in your own words?

How does 6:10-20 relate to Paul's purpose for writing the letter?

Read this passage each day this week, looking for something different each day (a key word, new thought about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit, a promise to claim, a sin to confess) underline, highlight or make notes in your bible or Scripture Journal.

What is the "promise" (verse 3) that Paul quotes along with the commandment (see also Deuteronomy 5:16)? Why do you think God put this commandment together with this promise? What connection do you see between them?
