Inside Jokes

Everybody loves a good inside joke. Well, that is if you are on the inside. If, however, you are on the outside, inside jokes aren't nearly as appreciated. If you are not on the inside, then such jokes can be confusing, frustrating, annoying, and even intimidating. (They are intimidating if we feel like such jokes are being told to *keep* us on the outside.) For those on the outside, inside jokes are anything but funny, comforting, or consolidating.

The gospel is not an inside joke. The church is not an inside joke. Righteous living is not an inside joke. Eternal life is not an inside joke.

But is it possible that to someone who is outside of the church, outside of righteous life, and outside of the hope of the gospel, all of our talk, our smiles, our jovial attitudes, and even...our Bibles might seem like some sort of an inside joke? And that hearing these things discussed among ourselves, but not really understanding what is being said, that they might feel frustrated, frightened, or even intimidated? Even like we are trying to *keep* them on the outside?

I don't think that any Christian would ever intentionally try to keep someone on the outside. And based on that judgment, no Christian would ever intentionally say something or do anything in a manner that would try to keep someone on the outside. But unintentional actions or words may be doing just that. While we would strive to not be condescending to anyone, we should perhaps think about how others are hearing our words and seeing our actions. Paul wrote, "According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it." (1 Corinthians 3:10, NKJV) Isn't that what we should be doing? Taking heed how we are building?

I get it. We get comfortable, we're in our own groups, we're in a hurry, we're hungry, we could make a thousand different excuses as to why we might do what we do and not give a though as to how what we are doing or saying might be received by someone on the outside. (And by the way, that person on the outside could potentially be someone you see at church regularly.)

"Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time." (Colossians 4:5, NKJV)
