Water only comes three ways: solid, liquid, or gas. The state of the same molecule of water can change an infinite number of times. And it does not matter what state you find it in, it is still water. On a day like the day this is being written, there is a lot of water that is moving from a solid state to a liquid state. All it took was a change of temperature.

This change of state is predictable. It is well know and established fact that water will be in a solid state below 0°C (32°F). Above 100°C (212°F), that same water will be in a gaseous state. In between those two points, water will always be in a liquid state. Always. It is so predictable, in fact, that if you need to change water from one of those states to another, you can do it. It can also be frustratingly predictable when you know it is going to change states and you don't want or need it to, but it does it anyway. All it took was a change of temperature.

In Jacob's blessing to his sons in Genesis 49, he declared concerning Reuben, his firstborn, "Unstable as water, you shall not excel" (verse 4). He wasn't describing water as being unstable as if you were playing that game where you try to fill a cup across a room with a spoon. Instead, his language points to the changing states of water, how it so easily goes from a solid to a liquid to a gas. Reuben, Jacob said, was like that. No matter what, he was still Reuben, but his state could easily transform depending on his surrounding environment. All it took was a change of temperature.

I suppose that to some degree, all of us have a little Reuben in us. A change in spiritual temperature can change our spiritual state of being. Much like water, that transition doesn't change who we are, it merely changes our state of being. And also much like water, it is predictable—to us, to God, to those around us, and even to the devil. (Unlike water, the point of change is unique to us all.) We may know exactly what spiritual temperature we need to be at to remain stable, and we may know what points will change us to an undesired state. All it takes is a change of temperature.

But unlike water, which has no say-so in what state it is in but is completely at the mercy of the changing temperatures, we have some control. We have enough control, in fact, that we can determine we like to change our state of being into a more suitable state. We have enough control that we can request help in changing our state of being. All it takes is a change of temperature.
