

#### Why Have a Youth Ministry? (Part 1)

As mentioned last month, we are glad to announce that Danny Myers has accepted our position of Assistant Pastor. He hopes to move with his family from Columbia, South Carolina in May and join us in the work. One of his primary areas (yet not solely) will be focusing on is working with youth in and outside of the church. This brings up the very appropriate question, what purpose does a youth ministry have in the local church? The next two months we will seek to answer this question..

One does not need to look far to find an assortment of different ideas of what constitute a youth ministry in the local church. Some churches completely de-emphasize the idea of youth as a separate entity of the church. They see the family unit as the only grouping that the Bible allows, which means that the "youth group" is the family, and the "youth ministers" are the parents. These types of churches hold little to no teaching or events designed especially for the youth. Other churches have a full-blown, always on-the-go, youth ministry. These churches emphasize the need for everything to be geared toward the children and youth. These youth groups turn into a mini-church, made up of only youth. With two seemingly conflicting view of youth ministry, how is one to know what is best for the church as a whole, and the youth particularly? Well, as always, when approaching such subjects that deal with faith and practice, it is a good reminder that the Word of God is our sole guide. When we do so we see two important emphasis emerge.

First, we need to be reminded that the Lord is the creator of all things, including children (Ps.139:13-16). This means that no child comes into this world by accident or mistake, but each has been created by God. Furthermore, by God's sovereign hand, each child has been placed into a specific home. No one is to be left without a home or a familial relationship, which is why God places special concern upon the widow and orphan (Isa.1:17; Jm.1:27). This familial relationship is to be more than a roof over their head, and people to take care of them. God's purpose for having families is so that godly offspring are produced (Mal.2:15). Since godliness does not come naturally, intentional steps must take place so it does. Those intentional steps are the raising, teaching, discipling, and interceding for the children the Lord has given. Ephesians 6:4 states, "And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord." This Scripture states that it is not primarily the responsibility of the state, or even the church, but the parents (under the oversight of fathers) to raise the children given to him. From this we can draw a very basic, yet foundational truth of Scripture – God calls parents to raise children in a godly manner.

Second, while the Scriptures do emphasize the family unit as primary, that does not mean there is not a secondary, yet very important role for the church to play. The church has a responsibility to "serve one another in love" (Gal.5:13) and use their gifts, "for the work of ministry, and for the edifying of the body of Christ" (Eph.4:12). In Titus 2, Paul exhorts Titus to teach the older women that they are to "admonish the young women" (2:4). This is not just a responsibility for women to teach women, but also, men teaching men, old teaching young, families teaching other families, etc. There is a corporate responsibility that extends beyond that of the familial unit to teach, train, and disciple. This corporate responsibility comes from the fact that we have a covenant duty to God and to one another. The covenant extends to more than just individuals and families, but to the body of believers as a whole.

This corporate and covenantal responsibility of ministering to one another, therefore, applies to how we look at youth in the church. Each church member has a responsibility to help, primarily by assisting the parents, to raise and nurture the children that have been entrusted by the Lord to that church. That is why it is a biblical principle that at every baptism of children, the members of the congregation stand up and take a vow to, "undertake the responsibility of assisting the parents in the Christian nurture of this child." How will individuals fulfill this covenantal vow if there are not specific venues in the church to assist and nurture the youth in the church? It cannot be done well if the family unit is the only recognized relationship of teaching and discipleship in the church. Therefore, having a youth group or events, where other members of that church can have a godly influence upon the youth, is both needful and biblical. It is a way that the corporate body of Christ can and should be a part of assisting the parents in their biblical duty of raising children.

Next month we will look at some of the practical aspects of what this type of youth ministry may look like in the local church. But as we close, we are delighted to announce this addition to our staff, but more so in the expansion of our ministry to children, youth, and beyond at Smyrna Church as we collectively seek to Know, Grow, & Show forth the love of Christ.
