The Profile of a False Teacher:

- Their Teaching (vs. 3)
 - o Their teaching is not consistent with the message of Jesus
 - o Their teaching does not result in godly living
- Their Attitude (4a)
 - o Those who teach things that are contrary to God's Word are proud and lack understanding.
- Their Actions (vs. 4b)
 - Those who teach things that are contrary to God's Word have an unhealthy desire for debate and controversy.
- Their Effect (vs. 4c-5a)
 - Those who teach things that are contrary to God's Word will cause division and fights
- Their Motivation (5b)
 - Those who teach things that are contrary to God's Word are motivated by selfish ambition
