

Children's lesson for April 26, 2020

Galatians 1:6-10

Listen to Pastor Cody's sermon with your family.

You might want to pull out last week's lesson to look at again. Remember, Paul has written this letter to the churches in Galatia to bring them back to the truth of the Gospel. False teachers were changing the message. **How did this make Paul feel? Draw a face emoji to show his feelings:**

Look at verses 8 and 9. **What did Paul say about all this?**

He said if he or the other apostles, or even an angel from heaven preached any other Gospel than what Paul and his companions had preached, let them be under a curse. It was so important that he wrote it twice! **2x**

Can you think of a time in the Bible where someone changed the Word of God?

Here is an example: **Read Genesis 2:16-17 What did God say to Adam and Eve?**



Now read Genesis 3:4-5. **How did Satan change God's Word?**

And what did this lead to? Yes, sin entered the world. There are always consequences to adding to, taking away from, or changing God's Word.




It is very important for us to know the truth of the Gospel and to know God's Word so that we can recognize when someone tells us something different. Everything we need today to be saved is in the Bible. **Look at 2 Timothy 3:16-17.** We need to read God's Word every day and obey it.

Paul went on to say that he was not seeking to please men because if he did, he would not be a servant of Christ. **What do you think he meant by this?**

Remember, he just told them that there is only one Gospel. Let's not get caught up in pleasing people and forget that. We can't water down the gospel to make it what it what people may **want** to hear. Do you know what that means? Have you ever added water to your drink? It takes some of the flavor away, right? You are adding something that makes the drink less tasty. We don't want to add anything to the Gospel to make it less than what it is.
