Today's Sermon

Title: Healing in the Eucharist

Preacher: The Rev. Clancy Nixon

-Jesus said at Mark 14:22 and 24, speaking of the bread and wine, "This is my body," and "This is my blood."

1. I believe the Real Presence of Christ comes with the Eucharist.

- The Roman Church since Thomas Aquinas in the 13th century has taught the doctrine of transubstantiation. Aquinas used Aristotelian philosophical categories of "substance and accidents" to say that the substance of the bread and wine are ontologically changed into the body and blood of Christ.
- Martin Luther taught the Real Presence of Christ is in the sacrament, but refused to speculate on precisely how this happens. This is called Consubstantiation.
- The higher your view of the Eucharist, the higher the benefit you will likely get from it. Jesus said, "As you have believed, let it be done for you." (Matt. 8:13)

2. Jesus came to save and to heal us.

- 1552 BCP- "grant that... we and your whole church family may obtain forgiveness of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion."
- Psalm 103:2,3 says, "Praise the Lord, oh my soul, and forget not all his benefits; who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases."
- Healing and salvation go together in the gospels. These two words we read in our gospels are a translation of the exact same Greek word, which is "Sozo."

3. There is healing in the Eucharist.

- Clancy's story of being saved and healed in the same Eucharist.
- The Eucharist can heal our imagination, giving us the best images of God, ourselves, our neighbors, and our world.

4. The blood is for forgiveness, but the body is ______.

- Matthew 8:16 and 17 says, "[Afterward, Jesus] healed all the sick. This was to fulfill the prophet Isaiah, "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases.""
- 1 Peter 2:24 says, "Who himself bore our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness by whose wounds you were healed."
- "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood will receive eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." (John 6:54)
- As you come forward to receive the bread today, I encourage you to ask God for healing in your life.


Officiant

The liturgy begins with the **Acclamation**, which is an "eager expression" of praise.

In this **Prayer for Purity**, we ask God to cleanse our hearts and minds of anything that comes between Him and us, anything that would impede our worship of Him. We offer to Him our whole selves that we might decrease and that He might increase, to the glory of Jesus Christ.


Children's Message and Worship

The word **Gospel** comes from an old German word which means "Good News," the great good news about Jesus the Messiah. We stand for the Gospel reading to show the importance we place on Jesus' words and actions.

In the Confession of Sin and Absolution, our sins, both individual and corporate, have been confessed, and we have been powerfully reassured of God's complete forgiveness through Jesus Christ. We begin with a cleansing admission and confession of sin followed by an authoritative pronouncement of God's forgiveness in Christ Jesus. This is always "ground zero" for Christians. We move out from here

Why Baptize Babies?

From the earliest times, children and infants were baptized and included in the church. As Scriptural authority, we cite Jesus' words, "Let the little children come to me, for is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs" (Mark 10:14). The baptism of children before they can respond with their own confirmation of faith is a compelling witness of grace.

The Baptism

The candidate being baptized today:

Celebrant Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith. Our Savior Jesus Christ said, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God"; and he commissioned the Church to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Here we ask our heavenly Father that this child, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Spirit, born again, and received into the Church as a living member of Christ's body. Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his abundant mercy he will grant to this child that which by nature he cannot have.

Celebrant The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents & Godparents I present Noah Alfred Watford to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Celebrant ask the Parents and Sponsors of the Candidate the following:

Celebrant Are you willing and ready to undertake this?

Parents & Sponsors I am, the Lord being my helper.

The Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and sponsors of the candidate.

Question Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness

that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this

world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from

the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Celebrant Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil,

and lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son

Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and

Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy

Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Answer I do.

Question Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and

walk in them all the days of your life?

Answer I will, the Lord being my helper.

Then the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying, (standing)

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support

this candidate in his life in Christ?

People We will.

Celebrant Let us join with this Candidate to proclaim our faith in the words

of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostle's Creed.

Celebrant Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People I do. I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and

earth.

Celebrant Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

People I do. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presentation:

In the early Church people were often given new names when baptized to further symbolize the transforming of their lives through Jesus Christ. For example, Saul became Paul when his heart was converted to the love of Jesus, The Christ.

The Candidate(s) and Sponsors stand before the altar rail, where the Candidates are presented by name. The Celebrant asks the Candidates six questions known down through the centuries as The Three Great Renunciations, followed by The Three Great Affirmations.

Baptismal Covenant:

Simply the Creed in Q & A form where we proactivly renew our belief and submit our lives to Jesus Christ.

Celebrant Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

People I do. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Celebrant Let us now pray for Gaines to receive the Sacrament of

Baptism. The parents and sponsors will lead us in the prayers.

Parent That Noah may come to confess his faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and

Savior.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That Noah may continue in the apostles' teaching and the

fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That Noah may walk in a manner worthy of the calling which he

has been called, ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That Noah may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever he falls

into sin, repent and return to the Lord.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That Noah may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God

in Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That as a living member of the Body of Christ, Noah may grow up

in every way into him who is the head.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent That, looking to Jesus, Noah may run with endurance the race set

before him, and at the last receive the unfading crown of glory.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Parent Heavenly Father, from you the gift of your image is fearfully

formed and wonderfully knit together in our mother's womb. Before we are named we are known. On this Sunday now set apart to acknowledge the gift of life and the sanctity of the human soul, we pray you preserve the works of your hands especially in the yet unborn. And give us your grace as we bear the responsibility for

stewardship of all your good gifts in Jesus Christ.

People We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.

Celebrant Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy

you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, pointing to the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look

mercifully upon this your servant. Wash and sanctify him through your Holy Spirit, that he may be delivered from

destruction and received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, he may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In water we are buried with Christ in his death. By water we share in his resurrection. Through water we are born again by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Celebrant Noah Alfred Watford, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying

Noah, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen*.

When all have been baptized and signed, the Celebrant says

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, received him as your own child by adoption, made him a member of your holy Church, and raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that he may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Baptism is the Beginning, not the End

Baptism is but a "pilot light" that effects little in life if not fueled and fed. Next step: Bring this child back next Sunday for worship and continued forming in faith, so that in years to come, he or she will have the tools to publicly confess their faith through confirmation (Parents, this means you are their chief teachers about Jesus-Deuteronomy 6). So, Baptism simply marks the beginning of a journey.

The **Peace** is a particularly good time to welcome visitors and newcomers. Please take a moment to extend God's peace to those around you. That peace, which the world cannot give, comes only through the forgiving of Jesus Christ. This peace is not rooted in our circumstances but in the presence, promise, and power of God and Christ's redeeming work.

The Celebrant, Candidate, and Sponsors return to the altar rail and the Celebrant says Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in the royal priesthood of all his people.





The Eucharistic Prayer is centered in the atoning death of Jesus Christ upon the cross. His suffering there in our place is the only sufficient ground or basis for our standing before God. Our joy in the present and our hope for the future all flow from the reality of God's

redeeming work in the historic

event of the crucifixion.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace. On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave

All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.




We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

The Lord's Prayer, so called because Jesus gave this prayer to His disciples as an example of how to pray, has been a part of Eucharistic liturgies since year 400 A.D. The link between our daily bread and the spiritual food we receive in the Eucharist is very ancient. In the Lord's Prayer, we ask for daily bread, meaning the things we need to get through each day. But as a part of that, the sacramental bread also symbolizes God's presence, which is something that is also essential to our getting through the day.

During Communion:

When we gather together, we remember the presence of Jesus. By repeating the words and actions of Jesus' last meal with His disciples, we join the story and make it our own. We don't just watch the drama or listen to it unfold, we enter into the story as we, too, take the bread and wine and eat and drink.

The Celebrant invites the people to Communion.

All baptized people may come for Communion. Unbaptized people and young children may come for a blessing, presenting themselves to the ministers with arms crossed over their chests.

As you approach the rail, you may choose to receive the bread and wine from the cup at the rail, or indicate you want a mini-chalice by placing your right hand over your heart. Please consume the elements in the mini-chalice at the rail.

* Gluten Free Wafers are Available: If you need a gluten free wafer, please indicate this at the altar rail by placing your hand over your heart. Those at the rail will receive the bread in their hands, eat the bread, and then guide the chalice to their lips for a sip of the wine.

Those seated upstairs may receive Communion or a mini-chalice at a station in the balcony. Please wait until the Communion ministers are in place, then follow the direction of the ushers.

ORDER FOR RECEIVING COMMUNION

General: Two lines in center aisle, returning to pews via side aisles

SIDE AISLES begin first, walking to the back and using the back Crossing Aisle to access the center aisle. Please return to your seat using the side aisles.

CENTER AISLES are second, starting from the back. <u>Please</u> return to your seat using the side aisles.

Those seated in the center aisles from the **READER'S PEW** forward (pew # 42–39, including front crossing aisle pews) <u>may</u> return to their seats using the center aisle.

Those seated upstairs may receive Communion at a station in the balcony.






