Message

The Federal Government of India has opposed in the Supreme Court the legalization of same sex marriages, citing "religious personal laws", societal morality and the existence and continuance of the State. It further said allowing same sex marriages will have far reaching consequences including a requirement to amend the Hindu marriage Act, Muslim Marriage Act, Christian Marriage Act and the Special Marriage Act.

In India despite statutory recognition of the relationship of marriage between a biological man and a biological woman, marriage necessarily depends upon age old customs, rituals, practices, cultural ethos and societal values.

But there is a completely different picture which is in the Church of England. The Church of England with its explanation has given a clear indication that the Church of England is moving a step at a time to fully accept the practice of homosexuality as part of the life and practice of the English Church. The endorsement of the House of Bishops of the Church of England on the blessing of same sex marriage in the church, have outright denied the doctrine of biblical anthropology regarding gender identity and moral behavior. To quote Archbishop Foley Beach "the Church of England has authorized the blessing of sin and declared that sin is no longer sin"


Kobita receives Easter greetings card from her sponsor
