At least once a year I like to share one of the simplest, yet most profound bits of scripture (above) along with Chuck Swindoll's words (below) which speak concisely and powerfully to the significance of **our attitudes** in life. I share these with you yearly, because I truly believe that *in them* is incredible wisdom and understanding which is vital for good health. Especially in our environments of such rapid change, challenge and enticements away from God's absolute Truth.

"Attitude" is an interesting word. It has some intriguing definitions associated with it. Among the meanings important to us, as Jesus' followers, is the understanding that our attitudes are *states of mind or feelings* that we **freely choose** and **act on**. Our attitudes are our natures we share with folks around us; not only at home, places of work, or school, but everywhere we do life. Both with ourselves and while we are alone. How close are you in *being* Jesus to yourself? To others?

Our attitude greatly impacts not only how well we fair and cope in this world, but it speaks volumes to those around us as to who we **really are**. Especially as **Jesus' ambassadors** on earth. As we ponder our final weeks of Summer, vacations coming to a close and Fall soon being upon us, *this is* a great time to take true stock in our attitudes for the remainder of this year. Earlier this year, a St. Paul's family bequeathed St. Paul's a very substantial monetary gift which went into our **St. Paul's Growth Fund**.


Recall the "Growth Fund" includes the previous **Building Fund** and now also provides for additional future needs of our congregation, both anticipated and unanticipated.



A clean slate

One of the best things about heading back to school is the chance for a fresh start. A new year, new teachers, perhaps even a new school offer students the opportunity to try a little harder and do a little better than the year before.
