Feedback from the congregation at that conference is being carefully considered before the constitution is offered again to our church body for approval. Board of Deacons Report: 13 December 2023

The Board of Deacons met on Wednesday, December 13, 2023, for the final meeting of 2023. Alan Garner welcomed our newly elected Deacons, Lisa Carraway, Kim Parr, Robert Abernathy and Betty Johnson to the Board. He also acknowledged the members who have completed their terms and will be leaving the Board: Mike Beale, Jonathan Martin, Pat Wyatt and Evelyn Jones. Jimmy Judkins, who will serve as Chairman of the Board for 2024, recommended the approval of Ginnie Kinsey as Co-Chair and Lisa Carraway as Clerk, both of whom agreed to serve. The following items were discussed.

- Ginnie Kinsey reported the Food Missions continues to grow and our church participated in the Suffolk Community Effort Thanksgiving Food Drive and the Holland Community Food Drive. The Board voted to establish a SCC/City School Mission. Our January Yellow Envelope will support our new initiative. Our Yellow Envelope for February will be designated for Coats for the Community. It was also reported we received our annual donation of \$5,000 from the Talmadge Darden Trust to support our Food Missions.
- 2. The Board voted to make a donation from the Sheltering the Homeless Mission to assist Cheryl Griffin in establishing a non-profit, Beacon of Hope in Western Tidewater, Inc.
- 3. The Board previously approved a request from All Saints Presbyterian Church to use our building for a second Sunday service beginning at 2:00 PM. This request has been approved by both Churches and this service will begin in January.
- 4. At the request of the Board, Dr. Hartman has researched several possible organizations with which we could consider an affiliation in the future. The Board chose to obtain additional information on the CBF Group. We are familiar with this group as we have used this resource to assist us in providing our special offering donations collected for distressed areas. A representative of this group will be asked to meet with the Board in either January or February.
- 5. Dr. Hartman will begin meeting with the four groups which were formed at our Town Hall Meeting held on November 12, 2023, to begin working on these initiatives.
- 6. The Board will hold a Town Hall Meeting with a covered dish luncheon on January 21, 2024, following the 11:00 AM service to give the congregation a time to ask any questions or express any concerns regarding the revisions to the Church Constitution. It is hoped all will attend.
- 7. Alan Garner was thanked for his service as Chair to the Board for 2023.

What "Coats for the Community 2024" will look like is this: We continue to maintain a Coats Closet on the 3rd floor and will accept donations of gently used coats, hats, scarves, gloves and mittens. We have also purchased some coats to stock the Closet and will purchase coats for specific needs as we learn of them. The Adult Bible Class sponsors this project but it is a church wide effort and we hope you will participate with us. Class members do the purchasing with our available funds but we also invite and encourage any church member to help in this procurement process. We very much need your help to get warm coats into the arms of those who need them. Please let us know of any need you may learn about and please feel free to bring someone to church to look for a coat. The room is not locked...you can access it through the Adult Bible Classroom. We invite your participation and ideas. We are always interested in ways we can serve our community more productively. And as always our aim is to glorify our Father.
