Our Lenten Journey

Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptations and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is also a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for

baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, we focus on our relationships with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

This year, our theme for Lent will be "Forgiveness." Over the next five Sundays we'll look at:

God's Preemptive Grace
Forgiveness and our relationship with God
Forgiving others
Forgiving ourselves and
Corporate forgiveness.

Each week we'll delve into stories in Scripture that will help us live into these challenging but liberating principles. I pray that this will be a fruitful season that will lead us into a glorious Easter. As we enter this season, I offer this prayer for our reflection:

Sometimes I need a clean slate, a fresh start, a new beginning, new life from a world of death. God, let me embrace your forgiveness so that I may know to the depths of my soul that as I offer my brokenness I am made new. Amen.*

March's Mission: Western Tidewater Free Clinic

The yellow envelope for March is designated for the Western Tidewater Free Clinic by the SCC Board of Deacons. This is a local mission, most worthy of our support. WTFC was opened in 2007 and serves the Western Tidewater area. It is a health home for uninsured, underinsured and underserved adults, delivering compassionate and quality care through many programs. It states its mission this way, "to provide high-quality, non-emergency health care to the residents of Western Tidewater who cannot otherwise afford it." Several of our church members were instrumental in starting this endeavor and many more continue to serve and support it today. We encourage you to please give what is on your heart to this mission, by using March's yellow envelope.

- 1. New Church Ministerial Assistant (Church Secretary) -- Suzanne Flemming.

 Her hours are Tuesday through Friday, 9:00am until 2pm. If you are nearby on those days of the week, please stop by and introduce yourself to Suzanne.
- 2. Part of our facility has been leased for 12-18 months by a new start-up church, the Reformation Presbyterian Church. The mother church is based in Virginia Beach. This new church has outgrown its initial meeting location, which was held at one of the member's homes. After much searching, they found our church facility to be exactly what they needed.
- 3. The Pastor search team has been active, interviewing potential ministers.
- 4. The Board has a committee working on our Church's Constitution and will hopefully complete that task later this year. Once the Deacons have approved the updated document, it will "lie on the table" for 90 days for all to read and question before coming to the Conference for your approval.
- 5. The March yellow mission envelope will provide funds to the Western Tidewater Free Clinic.
- 6. The Board approved our Church providing meals for the Winter Shelter program for 02/13/23 through 02/21/23, and also for the Night Stay program and Winter Shelter program for 02/22/23 through 03/08/23.
- 7. Spring Conference will be held on Wednesday, March 29, 2023, at 7:00 pm in the West Memorial Classroom.
