11. Read 21:8-10. How does Ishmael treat Isaac? Why is this ironic?
12. Was Sarah correct theologically in v. 10 – would Ishmael be heir with Isaac? Does that excuse her treatment of him and Hagar? (Note: how does Sarah refer to Hagar? Where else had Sarah treated Hagar with harshness?)
13. How does Abraham respond to Sarah's demand?
14. What was the reason God told Abraham to heed the voice of Sarah? How does this instruct us concerning God's sovereignty in accomplishing his purposes?
15. What does God tell Abraham to comfort him? Why does he say he will do this? Where else did God make this promise to Abraham concerning Ishmael?

16. How does Abraham respond to God's instructions?
17. Who is the focus of the narrative in vv. 15-16? But who's voice did God hear in v. 17? Why is this significant in light of the previous verses?

 Day 3 Read Genesis 21 again. 19. What does Abimelech recognize about Abraham and God in vv. 22-23? Recall Abimelech's compassion toward Abraham in 20:14-16. What does he ask of Abraham?
20. How does Abraham respond to Abimelech in v. 24?
21. What do vv. 25-34 reveal about Abimelech and his commitment to Abraham? What do these verses teach us about Abraham's commitment to Abimelech?

22. What do vv. 25-34 teach us about God and his faithfulness?
