Mark 1:14-20

Remember to begin your study early in the week so that you have time to really think (and keep thinking) about the passage without being rushed.

❖ DAY 1

Read Mark 1:14-20

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Commands are double-underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

14 Now after John had been taken into custody,

Jesus came into Galilee,

preaching the gospel of God,

15 and saying,

"The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

16 As He was going along by the Sea of Galilee,

He saw Simon and Andrew,

the brother of Simon,

casting a net in the sea;

for they were fishermen.

17 And Jesus said to them,

"Follow Me,

and I will make you become fishers of men."

18 Immediately they <u>left</u> their nets

and followed Him.

19 Going on a little farther,

He saw James the son of Zebedee,

and John his brother,

who were also in the boat mending the nets.

20 Immediately He called them;

and they left their father Zebedee

in the boat with the hired servants,

and went away to follow Him.
