Mark 10:32-45

As Pastor Bret begins his sabbatical, this week begins three weeks with guest preachers before our summer series on the person and work of Christ begins June 2nd. We are excited to have Dr. Jason Allen, the president of Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary with us this coming week to preach on Mark 10:32-45.

❖ Day 1

Read Mark 10:32-45.

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Commands are double-underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before, or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

23. What is the foundational principle for greatness according to this passage?
24. What are some practical ways this passage impacts you?
