Matthew 6:10

Remember to begin your study early in the week so that you have time to really think (and keep thinking) about the passage without being rushed.

❖ Day 1

Read Matt 6:9-13.

1. Recall from last week the context of the disciples' prayer in 6:9-13.
2. Matthew 6:9-10 includes three petitions to God. What are those petitions?
3. How is the request of v. 9 related to the requests of v. 10?
4. What does the phrase "your kingdom" indicate? (6:10a)
5. What is the description of the kingdom in v. 10?

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◆ Day 2

Read Matthew 6:9-13 again.

6. The kingdom of heaven holds both present implications and future implications. What do we learn about the present implications of the kingdom from 3:2, 4:17, 18:20, and 28:20?
7. What do we learn about the future implications of the kingdom in Matt 24:30?
8. What does the petition “your kingdom come” tell us about this kingdom?
9. How can you more specifically pray for God’s kingdom to come?

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10. Read 6:33. How does our view of the kingdom impact anxiety? How does this idea fit with the Lord's prayer in 6:9-13?

11. What is God's will as referenced in 6:10?

12. How is God's will done in heaven? When will God's will be done in this way on earth?

❖ Day 3

Read Matthew 6:9-13 again.

13. Read Matt 7:21. How does this relate to the petition in 6:10b?

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14. Compare the petition in 6:10b with the petition in 26:42. What does Jesus appear to believe about the Father's will?

15. Read Matt 12:50. How does this verse relate to 6:10b?

16. Why might Jesus include the phrase "on earth as it is in heaven?" (6:10c)

17. How does this text inform your prayer life?

18. How can you apply this passage this week?
