Christmas in the Psalms - Psalm 23

Last week and this week, as we fix our gaze on the first coming of Christ, and look to his second coming, we'll be straying from our study of 1 Corinthians to go to the book of Psalms. We'll be looking at a couple of Psalms and what they call us to anticipate at the Messiah's coming. This week we'll be in Psalm 23.

❖ Day 1

For these lessons, the sermon text is provided in a format that visually helps display the structure of the paragraph or section of text. The main verbs are underlined. Generally, the main indicative clauses remain to the left, and the other clauses are either directly underneath when they have equal priority to what comes before, or are tabbed to the right when the clause supports, develops, or draws a conclusion from a neighboring clause.

Psalm 23 - A Psalm of David

- 1 The LORD is my shepherd;
 - I shall not want.
- 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures.
 - He <u>leads</u> me beside still waters.
- 3 He restores my soul.
 - He <u>leads</u> me in paths of righteousness
 - for his name's sake.
- 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil,
 - for you are with me;
 - your rod and your staff, they comfort me.
- 5 You <u>prepare</u> a table before me
 - in the presence of my enemies;
 - you anoint my head with oil;
 - my cup overflows.
- 6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me
 - all the days of my life,
 - and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD
 - forever.

5.	Look up Gen 48:15, 49:24, Num 27:17, 2 Sam 5:2, Ps 80:1, Isaiah 40:10-11, Jer 31:10, Ezek 34:12, 34:15, 34:23-24, 37:24, and Micah 5:2-6. What portrait do these OT passages paint of the Lord, his shepherding work, and the Messiah?
