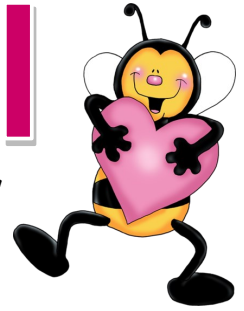

Season of Love:

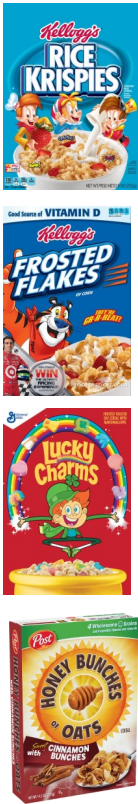

What's Cooking?

Pizza! We love it! Pizza has come a long way from its origin. I Googled "the history of pizza" and got a couple different answers. It may date back to the ancient Greeks, who cooked flat bread in mud ovens and added spices and toppings or back to 1889 in Italy Raffaele Esposito made a pizza for the Queen garnishing it with tomatoes, mozzarella and basil to represent the colors of Italy. The first American pizza shop opened in New York City in 1905. Up until then, pizza was considered a "foreign food".

Anyway, pizza can serve as an entire meal depending upon what crust and toppings is used. In our house, we have used store bought dough balls, bagels, English muffins, pita bread, gyro bread, Italian bread, burger buns or whatever else is on hand.

There are unlimited ideas for toppings; the standard cheese, pepperoni, sausage, bacon, cheeseburger, grilled BBQ chicken, Hawaiian, macaroni and cheese, vegetable, white spinach pizza and the list goes on.

You can give each person in your family a pita bread, for instance, let them put their own toppings on and have a pizza party. A favorite in our house is the bacon and cheese pizza!

Ingredients:

Pizza crust (anything listed above will do)

Pizza or spaghetti sauce-cover crust leaving 1/2" all around edge

Mozzarella cheese- as much as you want

Crumbled bacon (the more, the better)

Bake on baking sheet @350 for 12-15 minutes.

Preschool Activity

Take your preschoolers outside and help them understand that life is sacred. Using a bottle of bubble solution, blow bubbles into the air while encouraging your children to clap them, pinch them or catch them in their hands. Ask how the bubbles feel against their skin. Ask what is inside the bubbles. Air? No, breath. Let them take a turn blowing the bubbles.



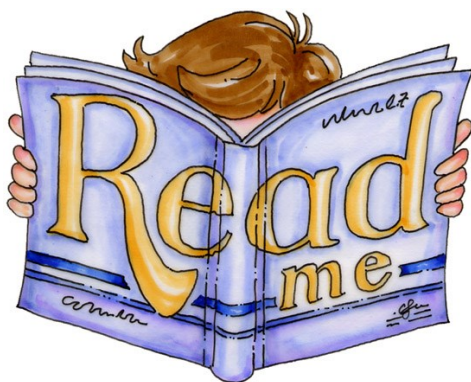
Now share this truth: Just as we can fill a bubble with our breath, that's how God filled man with His breath when He created us. Since it is easy for a bubble to pop or burst, it must be treated with care. In the same way, human life is fragile and must be protected because it is so valuable. Of all He created, God only shared His breath with humans, which makes us His most special creation.

Finally, blow more bubbles together and talk about the differences in their sizes. Think about the people in your family and discuss each person's uniqueness. Explain that though we are all different, we are similar in this: We have been made in God's image.
