Gems From Pastor Rob The Cross and Easter

Four things were finished on the cross:

- 1. All prophecies regarding His death and His suffering.
- 2. His suffering. Jesus lived every day in the shadow of the cross (every nail in the carpenter's shop, every piece of wood, every lamb in the temple was a reminder of His future)
- 3. The plan of salvation we can add nothing to it works are heresy. D.L. Moody said "salvation isn't do it's done."
- 4. Satan's power is finished. Jesus destroyed the power of death.

Thorns weren't in existence or mentioned until sin came into the world (Gen. 3:17,18). Jesus then bore a crown of thorns, because of the curse of sin.

Three things dealt with because of Christ's sacrifice for us:

His death – the penalty of sin His burial – the pollution of sin His resurrection – the power of sin

We all try to find time and energy to do what we want to do. The problem isn't always with our time, work, energy, relatives, or convenience. It's our hearts.

WHERE IS GOD?

When something goes wrong, you wonder where is God? He never promised to deliver us from all the wrongs and evils of this imperfect and sinful world. But He did promise three things: They all begin with the letter P:

- 1. HIS PRESENCE. "I will never leave you or forsake you: (Matthew 28:20, Hebrews 13:5). "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." The force of the Greek words say "Never – not even for a moment – will I leave you." It's not because your guardian angel has taken a nap or God has forgotten you. It's because we live in a broken world.
- 2. **HIS PEACE.** In the upper room Jesus told His disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you" (John 14:27).
- 3. **HIS POWER.** "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (II Corinthians 12:9). The word 'power' is the Greek word dunamis from which we get the word 'dynamite' and that speaks for itself. When you are weak you can become strong. (Source of info, Harold Sala in "Today Counts.")

Christ On The Cross

EVENTS OF THE CRUCIFIXION INCREDIBLY SIGNIFICANT

Consider the hours Christ hung on the cross. For 1500 years the people of Israel made a twice daily sacrifice of a lamb at 9 AM and 3 PM. Jesus Christ hung on the cross from 9 AM until 3 PM, from the third hour (Mark 15:25) until the 6th hour (Mark 15:33). For the Jews the first hour of the day always began at 6 AM (sunrise at 6 AM and sunset at 6 PM, the division of the two watches). There is nothing wasted or insignificant in Scripture. It is the most incredible book ever written. Its writing clearly reflects divine order with no happenstance, human contriving, or storytelling. It will take eternity to unearth all the truths contained therein.



RULING GOD OUT OF THEIR LIVES

Why do men think they can master it in a lifetime? What about those who want to rule God out so they can live their own lives with no accountability? They write about its so-called errors, or refuse to believe it is even God's Word when they've hardly even read the book (and certainly not a lifetime of reading), let alone studied it. If they have studied it, they have not viewed the whole, but only the parts they wish to criticize.

Commentators and critics argued about who killed Jesus. Jesus said "No man takes my life from me; I lay it down...." His death was sacrifice, not murder.

Jesus is the only one who has fulfilled all of the Scriptures regarding Messiah's birth, ministry, death and resurrection. There are over 3000 prophetic Scriptures in the Old Testament concerning the Messiah. Jesus fulfilled them all. All the armies that ever marched...and all the navies that ever were built...and all the parliaments that ever sat...and all the kings that ever reigned put together have not affected the life and future of mankind as powerfully as has that One Solitary Life. He came to die and to rise again, that all who are born again children of Christ through repentance and receiving Him as Saviour may live eternally with Him.

Christ's Resurrection

SKEPTICS SAY JESUS NEVER DIED; SO THERE WAS NO RESURRECTION OR EMPTY TOMB.

- 1. There is no evidence that Jesus was drugged. His obvious agony and death cry do not fit the picture of a drugged man who is about to die.
- 2. The heavy loss of blood makes death highly certain. He came to the cross already in serious to critical condition. He also suffered five major wounds between 9:00 o'clock and just before sunset. The nails were five to seven inches long and 3/8 of an inch square.
- 3. When His side was pierced with a spear, water and blood flowed out. This was evidence of His death, probably even before the spear wound. However, that final wound to His side would have been fatal in itself.
- 4. The Romans always broke the victim's legs to produce asphyxiation due to the inability to lift

- oneself to exhale. They never broke His legs
- 5. Jesus was embalmed in 75-100 pounds of spices and bandages and laid in a guarded tomb. Even if He had awakened in the tomb, He could not have unwrapped Himself, rolled the stone back and escaped unnoticed.
- 6. Pilate asked for assurance that Jesus was really dead before releasing the body for burial.
- 7. If Jesus had managed all this, His appearances following His resurrection would have been more like a resuscitated wretch than a resurrected Saviour. It is not likely that it would have turned the whole world upside down.
- 8. The 'Journal of the American Medical Society' concluded "The weight of historical and medical evidence indicates that Jesus was dead."

Therefore the assumption that Jesus did not die on the cross is at odds with modern medical knowledge.

OUTSTANDING PROOF THAT JESUS ROSE FROM THE DEAD

- 1. He was seen by more than 500 people on 12 different occasions. The appearances were long enough to be sure of His identity.
- 2. His resurrection body was not a "spiritual body" but He had flesh and bones, ate fish and could be touched.
- 3. The New Testament documents are totally <u>reliable historical documents</u>. They originate from the first-century eyewitnesses and are confirmed by other historical data of the time.
- 4. Jesus claimed to be God.
 - a. He predicted His own death and resurrection.
 - b. He lived a sinless and miraculous life.
 - c. He rose from the dead.

No other founder or teacher of any earthly religion claimed to be God as did Jesus. None offered <u>salvation by faith</u> apart from works. None ever <u>displayed the love for people</u> that Jesus did in dying for the sins of the world, and none ever rose from the dead.

It was the resurrection that <u>transformed the apostles</u> into convinced followers of Christ. They knew about false messiahs and so they were skeptical about Christ. However, <u>no false messiahs had ever risen from the dead</u>. If the Christ of the N.T. had not existed, <u>no one would have invented Him</u>.
