Austin Needham – CHILDREN'S MINISTRY ASSISTANT CANDIDATE

Joe Thompson – APPRENTICE DEACON CANDIDATE

When and where were you saved? Give a brief testimony. I had a very typical childhood that involved my mother taking my sister and I to church on a regular basis. As a child and as a young teen I looked at church as more of a task or chore than anything beneficial to me. As I progressed into my midteens I began to feel and sense a gap or empty part of my life. I kept up appearances on the outside but fell into depression on the inside. This depression led me down a road that continued to spiral downward. When I was 17, on a day that I

had skipped school, the vehicle I was in flipped onto its side. My neck was broken and I was left paralyzed from the neck down. I gradually regained the ability to stand and walk, but I have (and will always have) nerve damage to my left side. In spite of this massive wake-up call, I still was relying on only my power and strength. I could feel myself on the verge of slipping back into the same old habits that led to depression. Then, on October 28, 2000 I attended a drama called "Eternity" at Hunter Hills Baptist Church in Greensboro. The drama depicted different groups of people (two brothers, husband and wife, wheelchair bound man...) being faced with their eternities in either heaven or hell. About halfway through the program I simply began to weep. Not being a guy that cried at the time, this was a very strange feeling. I could literally feel the conviction of the Holy Spirit. At the conclusion of the drama, an invitation was given and my hand flew up. It felt like a giant weight had been taken away. My life since that day has been far from perfect but God speaks to me daily and I'm striving to be more like my Savior. It is a journey there is no question about that. I'll never forget my grandmother's words to me upon telling her I had accepted Christ. "Now comes the hard part." How right she was.

How long have you attended Triad? When did you join? *Our family began attending Triad since around 2004-2005, and we joined in 2008.*

In what capacities have you served or currently serve at Triad? Have served as a Sunday school teacher for High School Youth; youth leader; VBS guide; VBS teacher; VBS drama team and Upwards basketball and flag football coach. Currently serve as Sunday school teacher for a Young Married class.

What do you do as your profession? I work at Best Logistics in Kernersville. I'm in the freight brokerage division and I spend my days linking customer freight with the right trucks for the job.

Tell us a little about your family. I married my beautiful wife, Natalie in March of 2009. We have a sweet baby girl, Sophie, who just turned 1 at the end of August. Our other "child" is a little pup named Oscar. We have a very blessed life and we look so much forward to the adventurous years to come.
