A BASIC AGENDA



These are the basic elements in every Home Group meeting. You have the option of doing either the "message reflection" or the "deeper in the Word" sections. You likely won't have time to do both, especially if your group likes to share. Remember, the goal of your group is to build transformed lives, not to keep an agenda. Pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing. If you need to change things up, go for it.

ICEBREAKER

Take ten minutes to reconnect and get to know each other.

MESSAGE DISCUSSION

Discuss the teaching from the Sunday message. Hopefully, you've all seen it!

DEEPER IN THE WORD

Dig into the core scripture passage from the weekend teaching.

REFLECTION

Talk about the meaning of the text and how it personally applies.

PRAYER

Set aside time to share needs and pray for group members.

CORE TEXT

ROMANS 5:1-11 (ESV)

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. 3 Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. 6 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. 7 For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— 8 but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. 10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. 11 More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.



ICEBREAKER

If your group doesn't know each other well, or if you've been apart for a while, an icebreaker is a great way to assist you in getting reacquainted. Icebreakers also 'break the ice' and help people engage in conversation.

When you share information about yourself with others, and they accept you for who you are, it builds trust. This trust leads to greater transparency and openness. If you want some icebreaker ideas, check out the resources at the end of this book.

WEEKEND MESSAGE

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Have one or more people read the text out loud.

1. What does it mean to be reconciled to God? Have you ever had to reconcile a relationship before?
2. What is the "WE Scandal" that takes place in chapters 5-8? How can we encourage a "WE Scandal" in the church today during these polarized times?
3. What's your first gut response when you hear the phrase "rejoice in your sufferings?"
4. Rob expressed a number of different ways that people try to frame their suffering. How is the Bible's approach to suffering similar or different?
5. How is the believers' future hope an answer to suffering? Why is it important to know God's love when you are enduring suffering? How is this connected to the development of character?
6. "How do you know God loves you? Paul says just look to the Cross where Jesus suffered and died (Romans 5:8)." If you asked someone how they know God loves them, what do you think their response would be? How would you answer?
7. God's posture toward us is a "much more" kind of posture. Why would anyone assume that God would give us the bare minimum?
8. Is your great and future hope something that inspires or motivates you? Why or why not?

DEEPER IN THE WORD

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DEEPER IN THE WORD, PT. 1

ROMANS 5:1-11

Have one or more people read the text out loud before you start.

1. Romans 5 marks a shift in Paul's letter and builds upon a central belief that he shared in the first four chapters. What is that belief (verse 1)?
2. In verses 2-3, Paul gives two different scenarios where the believer can rejoice (boast)? How are these related?
3. Describe how the progression in verses 3-5 builds from one point to the next.
4. How is good character related to hope (verse 4)?
5. What reason does Paul give for us to be unashamed of our hope (verse 5)? How important is the knowledge and experience of God's love for a suffering believer?
6. Why does Paul emphasize that Christ died for us "while we were still sinners" in verse 8? How is this connected to what Paul said in the latter part of verse 5?
7. In verses 10-11 Paul explains how we are reconciled to God. What is the point of his "much more" statements in these verses?
