The hour I first believed


**My chains are gone, I've been set free

Will be forever mine




Acts 9:1
But Saul, still breathing threats and slaughter against the disciples of the Lord...




Acts 9:5

They led him by the hand, and brought him into Damascus.


Acts 9:9

"Here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on your name."




Acts 9:4

But the Lord said to him, "Go your way, for he is my chosen vessel to bear my name before the nations and kings, and the children of Israel."






Acts 9:16
"For I will show him how many things he must suffer for my name's sake."




Acts 9:19

When many days were fulfilled, the Jews conspired together to kill him, but their plot became known to Saul.




Acts 9:28
He was with them entering into Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord Jesus.




Acts 9:18


Acts 9:20

When Saul had come to Jerusalem, he tried to join himself to the disciples; but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple.




Acts 9:30
