WEEK 1

Sunday, December 30th

- [Jan 1] Luke 10:1-20 | The Church has inherited a mission like that of the seventy-two. Name at least one way in which you could use something in v.2-11 as a model for your personal ministry.
- [2] Luke 10:21-25 | Jesus reveals the nature of the Father to us. Name 3 characteristics of God that Jesus has shown us in Luke.
- [3] Luke 10:25-37 | List two examples of how Jesus modeled what it means to love God and your neighbor.
- [4] Luke 10:38-42 | Are you distracted with much serving in your life? Write down one way you can practice Mary's choice of loving Jesus, this week.
- [5] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 2

Sunday, January 6th

- [7] Luke 11:1-4 | What are the priorities Jesus models in His prayer? Do your prayers reflect this?
- [8] Luke 11:5-13 | Do you see God as a Father who gives good gifts to His children? Pray and ask God to shape and expand your view of Him.
- [9] Luke 11:14-26 | Praise Jesus that He and His Kingdom are greater than the works of the "prince of demons."
- [10] Luke 11:27-36 | What are you letting in through your "lamp" (v.34) – darkness or light? How could you increase the light flowing in?
- [11] Luke 11:37-53 | List the six woes Jesus declares. Which one resonates with you, and how will you respond?
- [12] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 3

Sunday, January 13th

- [14] Luke 12:1-12 | Read 1 Peter 3:14-16. What keeps you from being fully open about your faith? Pray about that.
- [15] Luke 12:13-21 | What is God saying to you through this passage? What will you do about it?
- [16] Luke 12:22-34 | Re-read verse 25-26. What are you anxious about? How does this passage bring you comfort?
- [17] Luke 12:35-48 | How does the fact that we do not know the hour of Jesus' return affect your daily life?
- [18] Luke 12:49-59 | Jesus can bring division into relationships. How should we respond when people turn against us because of Jesus?
- [19] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 4

Sunday, January 20th

- [21] Luke 13:1-6 | Jesus' hearers were looking at tragedies and assuming the victims deserved them due to their sin. Do you ever fall into this tendency, to view God's interaction with us as a formula?
- [22] Luke 13:7-17 | The people were rejoicing at the glorious things done by Jesus. Looking back over your life, how have you seen the hand of God working?
- [23] Luke 13:18-21 | The mustard seed was the smallest seed used by Palestinian farmers, yet the plant could reach 10 feet high. How is the Kingdom of God like this?
- [24] Luke 13:22-30 | Why did the Master not know the man knocking on the door? How does this passage make you feel?
- [25] Luke 13:31-35 | Jesus calls Jerusalem, "a city that kills the prophets." Have you ever rejected the truth when Jesus or a fellow believer has pointed it out to you? Spend time reflecting on this.
- [26] Review your notes from the week. What have you learned about the character of Jesus & how to follow Him?

WEEK 5

Sunday, January 27th

- [28] Luke 14:1-6 | What was wrong with the Pharisees' priorities? Have you ever prioritized rules over people?
- [29] Luke 14:7-14 | What character trait is Jesus highlighting in these passages? What can you do this month that reflects the principle in v.12-14?
- [30] Luke 14:15-24 | What is the point of this parable? What response does it call for us to make?
- [31] Luke 14:25-33 | This passage shows us that the cost of discipleship is high. Ask Jesus to increase your view of Him, to show you where you need to grow in your love of him versus your love of the world.
