The city has lost its way: Isaiah 1:4, 10-15

A new temple and transformed city are envisioned: Isaiah 2:2-5; 65:17-25

Ezekiel sees stark visions of judgment and destruction of the city, but in 40-48 the visions focues on God's return to a transformed heavenly city: "...And the name of the city from that time on shall be, The LORD Is There." Ezekiel 48:35 (ESV)
