2. Don't neglect the role of the local church in training you in godliness. Your pastor(s), as well as your brothers and sisters in Christ offer a wealth of experience and knowledge. Additionally, they have something that none of these teachers have to offer...a personal relationship with you. Who better to speak truth into your life than the people that are doing it alongside you?
3. Consider trustworthy the old adage, "there's nothing new under the sun." In other words, in the over 2000 years of Christian history and scholarship, there have been a lot of people thinking about and talking about God. Heresies have come and gone (and in many cases, come back around again) and orthodox faith has stood the test of time. If a resource claims to offer something novel or new...tread carefully.
